Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health/Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Public Health Fellowship Program

September 29, 2016

Provides leadership and professional opportunities at the CDC for students and graduate students of ASPPH member graduate schools and programs of public health. The fellowships are from one to two years in duration and will be located either at CDC headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia, or a CDC regional office. To be eligible, students must have received a Master's of Public Health or doctorate degree prior to the beginning of the fellowship.

Harry S. Truman Library Research Grant

October 1, 2016

Research Grants of up to \$2,500 are awarded twice annually to offset the cost of conducting research at the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum.

The Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations Dissertation Research Grants October 1, 2016

W. Stull Holt Dissertation Fellowship: Fellowship intended to defray the costs of travel necessary to conduct research on a dissertation project for students whose dissertation deals with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Bernath, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Lawrence Gelfand – Armin Rappaport – Walter LeFeber Dissertation Fellowship:

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of dissertation research travel for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Bernath, Holt, and Bemis grants.

Samuel Flagg Bemis Dissertation Research Grant: Fellowship to help defray the costs of domestic or international travel necessary to conduct research on scholarly projects for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants will be considered automatically for the Bernath, Holt, and Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber grants.

St John's College Research Fellowships

October 3, 2016

Research fellowships intended for outstanding researchers early in their careers (including graduate students) to carry out independent research in a stimulating and supportive academic environment.

Naval Research Enterprise Internship Program

October 23, 2016 (anticipated)

Summer internships for STEM students to participate in research at a Department of Navy laboratory.

Wolf Trap Internships

November 1, 2016

Spring, Summer, and Fall internships available to foster the next generation of arts leaders. 12-week program with flexible start and end dates in Washington, D.C.

Dumbarton Oaks Fellowships

November 1, 2016

Junior Fellowship: Fellowships for students who have fulfilled all preliminary requirements for the PhD or appropriate final degree and will be working on a dissertation or final project at Dumbarton Oaks under the direction of a faculty member at their own university.

Summer Fellowship: Fellowships for Byzantine, Pre-Columbian, or Garden and Landscape scholars on any level of advancement beyond the first year of graduate (post-baccalaureate) study.

Mellon Fellowships in Urban Landscape Studies: Fellowships intended for scholars and designers to pursue research on the history and current conditions of urban landscapes.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

November 1, 2016

Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research. The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to provide significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

DAAD Graduate Research Grants

November 4, 2016

For those who have completed a Master's degree and wish to conduct research in Germany, including those who wish to earn a doctoral degree in Germany.

Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Program in China Studies Travel Grants

November 9, 2016

Predissertation summer travel grants, postdoctoral fellowships as well as collaborative reading-workshop grants available for travel to China.

National Museum of the American Indian Internship Program

November 20, 2016

Internships are provided for students interested in the museum profession and related fields. Locations are in Maryland, Washington D.C. or New York for a duration of 10 weeks.

Travel (Continued)

Critical Language Scholarship Program

Late November (anticipated)

U.S. government effort to expand dramatically the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages (Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Punjabi, Swahili, Turkish, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Chinese, Japanese, and Russian).

Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics (SIAM) Student Travel Awards

Deadline: Seven months before the first day of the conference for which support is requested. Travel awards to help students attend and present at SIAM conferences.



Craft Fund Graduate Research Grant

September 17, 2016

Grants to support research for a master's thesis related to U.S. studio craft for students in arts architecture, education, and information studies.

AHIMA Foundation Scholarships

September 30, 2016

Merit Scholarships: Support for master's students in areas related to Health Information Management (HIM) or Health Informatics Technology (HIT).

Veterans Scholarships: Scholarships for veterans and their spouses in Health Informatics and Information Management programs.

American Water Works Association Academic Achievement Award

October 1, 2016

Recognizes contributions to the field of public water supply. All master's theses and doctoral dissertations relevant to the water supply industry are eligible.

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

October 1, 2016

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

American Nephrology Nurses Association Education Scholarships and Grants

October 15, 2016

Support for members in their pursuit of higher education as well as grants for clinical research projects and patient or staff education programs.

Master's (Continued)

Biographical Society of America Justin G. Schiller Prize for Bibliographical Work on Pre-20th Century Children's Books

October 15, 2016 (anticipated)

Encourages scholarship in the bibliography of historical children's books. Works put into nomination (English only) may concentrate on any children's book printed before the year 1901 in any country.

Paul Farmer Global Surgery Fellowship Research Associate

October 15, 2016

One-year position for medical students who wish to take time off between their 3rd and 4th year of medical school, as well as for those who are enrolled in a health-related graduate degree program with an interest in global surgical care.

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Fellowship October 15, 2016

Scholarships and grants for graduate students currently studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields who demonstrate the potential to advance understanding in the relationship between theology and the principles of the free and virtuous society, such as recognition of human dignity, the importance of the rule of law, limited government, religious liberty, and freedom in economic life.

American Concrete Institute Foundation Fellowship and Scholarship

October 16, 2016

Scholarships for eligible graduate students whose studies relate to concrete. Unlike the ACI Foundation Fellowships, those applying for scholarships do not need to be nominated by ACI-Member Faculty.

International Centre for Diffraction Data Ludo Frevel Crystallography Scholarships

October 19, 2016

Scholarships for graduate students with major interest in crystallography.

Hertz Foundation Graduate Fellowship Award

October 28, 2016

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for STEM students willing to make their skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency, such as fuel shortages, transportation and communication system overloads, deterioration of environmental quality, and malevolent utilization of cyperspace.

National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship Program (NSF GRFP)

Late October/Early November (depending on field of study)

Provides three years of support for the graduate education of individuals who have demonstrated their potential for significant achievements in science and engineering research. Students must be in their first or second year of a research based master's or PhD program and cannot have previously earned a master's degree. Open to students in STEM, STEM education, and the social sciences.

American Psychological Foundation Roy Scrivner Memorial Research Grant

November 1, 2016

Grant for empirical and applied research focused on lesbian, gay, and bisexual family psychology and lesbian, gay and bisexual family therapy for those working in STEM, behavioral sciences, social sciences, and related fields.

Society for Human Resource Management Student Scholarship Program

November 1, 2016

Scholarships may be used for master's degree programs with an emphasis area in HR or an HR-related program (such as business, psychology, or labor relations).

Florida Library Association Scholarships

November 2, 2016

Scholarships for students in Master's of Library Science graduate program.

National Science Foundation East Asia and Pacific Summer Institutes

November 10, 2016

Award provides first-hand research experiences in Australia, China, Japan, Korea, New Zealand, Singapore, or Taiwan; an introduction to the science, science policy, and scientific infrastructure of the respective location; and an orientation to the society, culture, and language.

Tallahassee Mayoral Fellowship Program

Mid-November

Yearlong fellowship for graduate students to engage with key areas of City government and serve in invaluable front-line positions alongside top leaders of City Hall. Open to those in public administration, urban and regional planning, social sciences, and related fields.

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

November 15, 2016 (anticipated)

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

GEM MS Engineering Fellowship Program

November 15, 2016

The objective of this program is to promote the benefits of a master's degree within industry. GEM Fellows are provided practical engineering summer work experiences through an employer sponsor and a portable academic year fellowship of tuition, fees, and a stipend which may be used at any participating GEM Member University where the GEM Fellow is admitted.

Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars Middle East Program Internships November 15, 2016

The Program concentrates on long-term developments and how such issues impact stability and growth in the region and its relations with the United States. The Middle East Program's meetings, conferences and reports assess the policy implications of regional developments (political, economic, and social), the Middle East's role in the international arena, American interests in the region, strategic threats to and from the regional states, and the role and future prospects of the region's energy resources.

Knowles Science Teaching Foundation Fellowship

November 27, 2016

Teaching fellowships for those who commit to teaching mathematics or science as their primary career, providing new math and science teachers (1st and 2nd year of teaching) with professional development, resources, and support to improve STEM education in our schools.

Garden Club of America Catherine H. Beattie Fellowship in Conservation Horticulture November 30, 2016

Annual research grant for graduate students in biology, horticulture, or a related field.

Philanthropic Educational Organization (P.E.O.) Program for Continuing Education

Deadline: 3-4 months prior to the start of the term for which the grant is requested One-time need based grants to women who are citizens or legal permanent residents of the U.S. or Canada for use in completing a degree or certification necessary for improving or gaining skills leading to employment.



AHIMA Foundation Scholarships

September 30, 2016

Merit Scholarships: \$2,500 award for students pursing a doctoral degree in areas related to Health Information Management (HIM) or Health Informatics Technology (HIT). One of the major initiatives of the AHIMA Foundation is to attract and support new talent in the HIM industry by improving educational opportunities for current and future HIM professionals through scholarships.

Veterans Scholarships: Scholarships for veterans and their spouses in Health Informatics and Information Management programs.

Dissertation Support: Support for doctoral students who are at the ABD stage.

The Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations Dissertation Awards October 1, 2016

Stuart L Bernath Dissertation Research Grant

Grant intended to help defray the expenses encountered in the writing of the dissertation by students working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Holt, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Myrna F. Bernath Fellowship

Fellowship intended to promote scholarship in U.S. foreign relations history by women. Awarded every two years (in odd years).

American Water Works Association Academic Achievement Award

October 1, 2016

Recognizes contributions to the field of public water supply. All master's theses and doctoral dissertations relevant to the water supply industry are eligible.

Doctoral (Continued)

Autism Speaks Dennis Weatherstone Pre-doctoral Fellowship Program

October 1, 2016 (anticipated)

Two-year fellowship for students interested in pursuing careers in autism research. Autism Speaks supports global biomedical research into the diagnosis, causes, prevention, and treatment of autism or its disabling symptoms. Funding supports the entire research continuum - from discovery to development to dissemination - for innovative projects that hold considerable promise for significantly improving the lives of those affected by autism.

K. Patricia Cross Future Leaders Award

October 3, 2016

Recognizes doctoral students who show exemplary promise as future leaders of higher education, who demonstrate a commitment to developing academic and civic responsibility in themselves and others, and whose work reflects a strong emphasis on teaching and learning. Student must be nominated by a faculty member or administrator.

American Physical Society Award for Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Research in **Biological Physics**

October 3, 2016

Award recognizes doctoral thesis research of outstanding quality and achievement in any area of experminetal, computational, engineering, or theoretical Biological Physics, broadly construed, and to encourage effective written and oral presentation of research results at the March meeting of the APS.

American Academy of Audiology Fellowships and Grants

October 4, 2016

Student Summer Research Fellowship: This summer research fellowship is for students in a program in audiology or hearing science who wish to gain a limited, but significant, exposure to a research environment.

Student Investigator Research Grant: The purpose of this grant is to support doctoral students working toward a degree in audiology or hearing science who wish to complete a research project as part of their course of study.

National Academy of Education/Spencer Dissertation Fellowship

October 6, 2016

The Dissertation Fellowship Program seeks to encourage a new generation of scholars from a wide range of disciplines and professional fields to undertake research relevant to the improvement of education. Supports individuals whose dissertations show potential for bringing fresh and constructive perspectives to the history, theory, analysis, or practice of education anywhere in the world.

National Science Foundation Doctoral Dissertation Improvement Grants in the **Directorate for Biological Sciences**

October 13, 2016

Dissertation Improvement Grants awarded in selected areas of the biological sciences. Proposals must fall within the scope of any of the clusters in the Division of Environmental Biology (DEB) or the Behavioral Systems Cluster in the Division of Integrative Organismal Systems (IOS).

*Funding is available from NSF in a variety of other fields.

Smith Richardson Foundation World Politics and Statecraft Fellowship

October 14, 2016

Grants to support PhD dissertation research on American foreign policy, international relations, international security, strategic studies, area studies, and diplomatic and military history. The fellowship's objective is to support the research and writing of policy-relevant dissertations through funding of fieldwork, archival research, and language training.

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Fellowship October 15, 2016

Scholarships and grants for graduate students currently studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields who demonstrate the potential to advance understanding in the relationship between theology and the principles of the free and virtuous society, such as recognition of human dignity, the importance of the rule of law, limited government, religious liberty, and freedom in economic life.

Paul Farmer Global Surgery Fellowship Research Associate

October 15, 2016

One-year position for medical students who wish to take time off between their 3rd and 4th year of medical school, as well as for those who are enrolled in a health-related graduate degree program with an interest in global surgical care.

American Nephrology Nurses Association Education Scholarships and Grants

October 15, 2016

Support for members in their pursuit of higher education as well as grants for clinical research projects and patient or staff education programs.

Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship in Women's Studies

October 15, 2016

Encourages original and significant research about women that crosses disciplinary, regional, or cultural boundaries. Previous Fellows have explored such topics as transnational religious education for Muslim women, the complex gender dynamics of trans identity management, militarism and the education of American women, and the relationship between family commitments and women's work mobility.

International Centre for Diffraction Data Ludo Frevel Crystallography Scholarships

October 19, 2016

Scholarships for graduate students enrolled in graduate degree programs with major interest in crystallography.

Doctoral (Continued)

American Council of Learned Societies Fellowships October 26, 2016

ACLS/Mellon Dissertation Completion Fellowships

Support for advanced graduate students in the humanities and related social sciences in the last year of PhD dissertation writing. The program encourages timely completion of the PhD.

ACLS/Luce Dissertation Fellowships in American Art History

Support for graduate students in any stage of PhD dissertation research or writing on the history of the visial arts in the United States.

IBM Ph.D. Fellowship

October 27, 2016 (anticipated)

Fellowships honor exceptional Ph.D. students who have an interest in solving problems that are important to IBM and fundamental to innovation in many academic disciplines and areas of study, including: computer science and engineering; electrical and mechanical engineering; physical sciences; mathematical sciences; public sector and business sciences; and service science, management, and engineering (SSME) and industry solutions (healthcare, life sciences, education, energy & environment).

Hertz Foundation Graduate Fellowship Award

October 28, 2016

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for STEM students willing to make their skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency, such as fuel shortages, transportation and communication system overloads, deterioration of environmental quality, and malevolent utilization of cyperspace.

National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship Program (NSF GRFP)

Late October/Early November (depending on field of study)

Provides three years of support for the graduate education of individuals who have demonstrated their potential for significant achievements in science and engineering research. Students must be in their first or second year of a research based master's or PhD program and cannot have previously earned a master's degree. Open to students in STEM, STEM education, and the social sciences.

American Psychological Foundation Roy Scrivner Memorial Research Grant

November 1, 2016

Grant for empirical and applied research focused on lesbian, gay, & bisexual family psychology & lesbian, gay & bisexual family therapy for students in STEM, behavioral sciences, social sciences, & related fields.

Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans

November 1, 2016

Every year, The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans supports thirty New Americans, immigrants or the children of immigrants, who are pursuing graduate school in the United States. Selection criteria emphasize creativity, originality, initiative, and sustained accomplishment. The program values a commitment to the Constitution and the Bill of Rights.

Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

November 1, 2016

The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to be a source of vibrant and significant work.

American Educational Research Association Minority Dissertation Fellowship Program in Education Research

November 2, 2016

Fellowship to support doctoral dissertation research and to advance education research by outstanding minority graduate students.

American Psychological Association Elisabeth Munsterberg Koppitz Child Psychology **Graduate Fellowship**

November 15, 2016

The fellowship promotes the advancement of knowledge and learning in the field of child psychology in order to nurture excellent young scholars for careers in areas of psychology, such as child-clinical, pediatric, school, educational and developmental psychopathology and to support scholarly work contributing to the advancement of knowledge in these areas.

Amelia Earhart Fellowships from Zonta International Foundation

November 15, 2016

Established in 1938 in honor of Amelia Earhart, famed pilot and Zonta club member. The \$10,000 Fellowships are granted annually to women pursuing PhD degrees in aerospace-related sciences or aero-space-related engineering. Women of any nationality pursuing a Ph.D./doctoral degree, who demonstrate a superior academic record in the field of aerospace-related sciences or aerospacerelated engineering, are eligible and encouraged to apply.

American Association of University Women (AAUW) American Dissertation Fellowship November 15, 2016

Fellowships for women pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conducting postdoctoral research, or preparing research for publication. Female candidates are evaluated on the basis of scholarly excellence, quality and originality of project design, and active commitment to helping women and girls through service in their communities, professions, or fields of research.

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

November 15, 2016 (anticipated)

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

GEM Fellowship Program

November 15, 2016

PhD Engineering Program: The objective of this program is to offer doctoral fellowships to underrepresented minority students who have either completed, are currently enrolled in a master's in engineering program, or received admittance into a PhD program directly from a bachelor's degree program. Fellowships may be used at any participating GEM Member University where the GEM Fellow is admitted.

Doctoral (Continued)

PhD Science Fellowship: The goal of this program is to increase the number of minority students who pursue doctoral degrees in the natural science disciplines — chemistry, physics, earth sciences, mathematics, biological sciences, and computer science. Applicants to this program are accepted as early as their senior undergraduate year, as well as candidates currently enrolled in a Master's of Engineering program and working professionals.

Tallahassee Mayoral Fellowship Program

Mid-November (anticipated)

Yearlong fellowship for graduate students to engage with key areas of City government and serve in invaluable front-line positions alongside top leaders of City Hall. Open to students in public administration, urban and regional planning, social sciences, and related fields.

Charlotte W. Newcombe Doctoral Dissertation Fellowships

November 15, 2016

Dissertation stage support for doctoral students whose work offers significant potential for advancing academic scholarship related to ethics and/or religion.

ACLS/Robert H. N. No Family Foundation Dissertation Fellowship in Buddhist Studies November 15, 2016

The American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS) announces the third year of an initiative supporting research and teaching in Buddhist studies, funded by a three-year grant of \$6.7 million from The Robert H. N. Ho Family Foundation. Working with the Foundation, ACLS offers an articulated set of fellowship and grant competitions that will expand the understanding and interpretation of Buddhist thought in scholarship and society, strengthen international networks of Buddhist studies, and increase the visibility of innovative currents in those studies.

Ford Foundation Fellowship Program—Pre-doctoral and Dissertation Fellowships November 17, 2016

Through its Fellowship Programs, the Ford Foundation seeks to increase the diversity of the nation's college and university faculties by increasing their ethnic and racial diversity, to maximize the educational benefits of diversity, and to increase the number of professors who can and will use diversity as a resource for enriching the education of all students.
