Assistant Dean of the Graduate School & Director of the Office of Graduate Fellowships and Awards Dr. Adrienne P. Stephenson was recently named an Assistant Dean of the Graduate School at FSU, where she serves as the Director of the Office of Graduate Fellowships and Awards (OGFA). Prior to working at Florida State University, Dr. Stephenson served as the STEM Center Coordinator at Tallahassee Community College where she managed the FAMU-TCC Bridges to the Baccalaureate in the Biomedical Sciences, FGLSAMP and STEM Star/Council Scholars Programs. She also served as a Science Specialist/STEM Coordinator at the Florida Department of Education for several years.

Adrienne received a bachelor's degree from Lincoln University in Pennsylvania, where she majored in Chemistry and was a LASER DOE/NASA Scholar. She then earned a master's degree in Pharmacology/Toxicology (2005) and a Ph.D. in Pharmacology/Toxicology (2014) from Florida A&M University. While a graduate student at Florida A&M University, she was a Harriet Jenkins NASA Fellow, McKnight Doctoral Fellow and the Delores Auzenne Fellow. She also served as an adjunct instructor in the College of Arts and Sciences.


