- Some awards have internal deadlines or specific institutional policies. OGFA will review these procedures with you


Workshops

Title: MBA Scholarship Program

Sponsor: National Black MBA Association Deadline: Will be available on May 18 Description: The National Black MBA Association provides financial support to graduate students pursing careers in business, academia and related professions. **Fields: Business**

Title: NOGLSTP Graduate Scholarship

Title: AIIS Junior Research Fellowships

Sponsor: American Institute of Indian Studies

Description: For graduate students conducting research for their doctoral dissertations in India. *Fields*: Any

Deadline: July 12, 2015

Description: Internships are provided for students interested in the museum profession and related fields. Locations are in Maryland, Washington D.C. or New York for a duration of 10 weeks.

Title: Fulbright Full Grants

Deadline: On-Campus Deadline July 7, 2015

Description: The Fulbright Program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State and is the largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students to undertake graduate study and advanced research worldwide in over 140 countries. Over 1,100 Fulbright awards are made annually. FSU students must apply through the Office of Graduate Fellowships and Awards or the Office of National Fellowships.

Title: Fulbright English Teaching Assistantships

Sponsor: Fulbright

Deadline: On-Campus Deadline: July 7, 2015

Description: Teaching Assistantships in English are offered in many countries worldwide. Placements are in schools or universities outside of the capital cities. Assistants design various activities to improve their students' language abilities and knowledge of the US, while increasing their own language skills and knowledge of the host country. FSU students must apply through the Office of Graduate Fellowships and Awards or the Office of National Fellowships.

Title: <u>Eli Lilly and Company, ACS Women Chemist Committee Travel Awards</u>

Deadline: September 15, 2015 *Description*: Need-based grants offered to graduate and postdoctoral women chemists to travel and present the results of their research at scientific meetings. *Fields*: Chemistry

Title: German Bundestag Internship

Sponsor: German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

Deadline: September 15, 2015

Description: Interns will be placed with individual members of the Bundestag and their offices. In addition, interns have the opportunity to study legislative and administrative procedures in the German parliament. PhD students are not eligible. Must be fluent in spoken German.

Description: The awards will be made to individuals who are committed to a career in teaching and research at the college or university level and are well prepared to use diversity as a resource for enriching the education of all students.

Sponsor: National Science Foundation *Deadline*: August 15, 2015 *Description*: Supports basic scientific research on the causes, consequences, and complexities of human social and cultural variability.
