ACRP: Graduate Research Award Program on Public-Sector Aviation Issues

Stipend for graduate students researching airport and related aviation system issues. The program is intended to stimulate thought, discussion, and research by those who may become the future airport managers, operators, designers, and policy makers in aviation.

AccessLex Grant Programs

Aimed at supporting students in graduate-level Law programs, AccessLex offers three grant programs: the Diversity Pathway Intervention Grant Program, the Bar Success Intervention Grant Program, and the Bar Success Research Grant Program. Deadlines vary based on award.

Airport Cooperative Research Program (ACRP) - Graduate Research Award on Public Sector Aviation Issues

The ACRP Graduate Research Award is intended to stimulate thought, discussion, and research by those who may become the future airport managers, operators, designers, and policymakers in aviation. The focus of this program is on applied research on airport and related aviation system issues to improve the quality, reliability, safety, and security of the U.S. civil aviation system well into the foreseeable future.

American Psychological Foundation (APF) Violet and Cyril Franks Scholarship

The APF Violet and Cyril Franks Scholarship supports graduate-level scholarly projects that use a psychological perspective to help understand and reduce stigma associated with mental illness. The scholarship helps address research which shows that stigma is a significant barrier to treatment and recovery for many of the 50 million Americans living with mental illness.

American Society of Mammalogists (ASM) - Graduate Student Fellowships

Grants and fellowships support graduate student members of the ASM engaged in research in any area of mammalogy to assist them in the early development of their careers.

American Nurses Foundation Research Grants

The American Nurses Foundation Nursing Research Grant encourages the research career development of all nurses. Clara Mayo Grants

This program was set up to support masters thesis or pre-dissertation research on aspects of sexism, racism, or prejudice, with preference given to students enrolled in terminal master's programs. Studies of the application of theory or the design of interventions or treatments to address these problems are welcome.

Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation Grant for Artists

Awards five grants in the amount of \$17,000 (CAD) and subsequent grants of \$20,000 each. Applicants must be between 18 and 41 years of age at the time of submitting the application. Not for those pursuing abstract or nonrepresentational art.

Foundation for Community Association Research Byron Hanke Fellowship

Fellowship available to graduate students working on topics related to community associations. Fellows are expected to prepare a research paper on community associations.

Florida House of Representatives Legislative Intern Program

Intern program that gives students legislative and policy experience working on projects, bills, amendments, and analysis. The internship pays a stipend and tuition.

Gutmacher Institute - Cory L. Richards Master's Scholarship in Public Policy on Reproductive Health and Rights

The scholarship supports master's students in the disciplines of public health or public policy who are pursuing careers advancing public policy related to sexual and reproductive health and rights.

IEEE Life Members Graduate Study Fellowship in Electrical Engineering Award for first year, full-time graduate students for work in electrical engineering.

Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) - Graduate Study Fellowship in Electrical Engineering

Applicant must have majored in the field of electrical engineering and have received a Bachelor's Degree from an engineering college of recognized standing worldwide. Must be pursuing master's degrees in electrical engineering.

Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) - Photonics Society - Graduate Student Scholarship

IEEE Photonics Society Graduate Student Scholarship provides scholarships to outstanding Society student members pursuing graduate education within the Society field of interest.

Mozilla Fellowships for Science

NCAA Graduate Student Research Grant

Research grants for students conducting research within the general topic areas of student-athlete psychosocial well-being and college athletics participation.

Thermo Fisher Scientific Antibody Scholarship Program

This scholarship is offered to graduate students in biology, chemistry, biochemistry, or a related life science field.

American Psychological Foundation (APF) - The Trust Eric A. Harris, EdD, JD Grant

\$5,000 to support an early career psychologist or graduate student for research or a project in the area of ethics and risk management.

American Psychological Association (APA) Wayne F. Placek Research Grant

Grants support empirical research to increase the general public's understanding of homosexuality and sexual orientation, and to alleviate the stress that lesbian women, gay men, bisexual women, bisexual men and transgender individuals experience in this and future civilizations.

American Planning Association Judith McManus Price Scholarship

American Translators Association Student Translation Award

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies

Center for Khmer Studies (CKS) -Programs and Fellowships

Fellowships support U.S., Cambodian, and/or French scholars (or EU citizens holding a French degree) in the social sciences and humanities conducting research in Cambodia and Southeast Asia.

Hospitality Industry Network

NEWH ICON of Industry Scholarship

A \$7,500 scholarship awarded to students pursuing careers in a field similar to that of a given year's selected NEWH ICON (changes annually).

NEWH Fabric Innovations Legacy Scholarship

This \$10,000 scholarship is open to hospitality management or interior design students in NY or FL.

Houtan Foundation - Graduate Scholarship in Iranian Studies

The Houtan Foundation offers scholarship to students from all origins – Iranian and non-Iranian – who have high academic performance and proven interest in promoting Iran's great culture, heritage, language, and civilization.

Kenneth and Barbara Starks Plant Resistance to Insects Graduate Student Award

American Heraldry Society - William Barton Graduate Scholarship

Barton Scholarships support master's and doctoral students conducting research on heraldry (coats of arms, seals, badges and related symbols) within the United States and its territories and possessions. Eligible disciplines include, but are not limited to, history, literature, law, anthropology, sociology, political science/government, archaeology, art history, architecture and design, and communication studies.

American Translators Association Student Translation Award

Grant-in-aid to a student for a literary or sci-tech translation or translation-related project. Also includes support for attending ATA's Annual Conference.

American Numismatic Society - Eric P. Newman Summer Graduate Seminar in Numismatics Grant

Grants offer graduate students the opportunity to work hands-on with one of the world's preeminent numismatic collections. The 8 week course taught by the museum staff, guest lecturers, & a visiting scholar introduces students to the methods, theories & history of the discipline. The seminar is meant primarily for those with limited or no numismatic background in order to familiarize students of (art) history, textual studies, & archaeology with a body of evidence that is often overlooked and poorly understood.

American Society of Legal History Cromwell Dissertation Prize

Promotes and encourages scholarship in legal history, particularly in the colonial and early national periods of the United States. The Foundation has supported the publication of legal records as well as historical monographs.

APS Award for Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Research in Biological Physics

Dwight David Eisenhower Transportation Fellowship Program

For master's and PhD students with at least one academic year left. Supported fields include engineering, life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences, arts and architecture, information systems, management, public affairs, biology, chemistry, computer science, environmental science, math, physics, business, economics, aviation, logistics management.

Fellowship for ROC Students Abroad Council of Writing Program Administrators Research Grant

The Council of Writing Program Administrators invites proposals for research projects investigating issues/practices in writing program administration. Awards are offered in a general and a targeted research category.

Florida Association of School Psychologists Graduate Studies Award

Awards to support students working in the area of school psychology.

Florida-Mexico Institute Out-of-State Tuition Waiver

The Florida-Mexico Institute (FMI) promotes commercial, cultural, and educational linkages between Florida and

Mexico. The FMI provides out-of-state tuition waivers to eligible students.

Guy Harvey Fellowship

Supports graduate students enrolled full-time at Florida institutions of higher education conducting research related to the biology, ecology, habitat or management of fish in Florida's waters. Fellowships are \$5,000 each.

Hurst Review/American Association of Colleges of Nursing Scholarship

Scholarships for students pursuing professional nursing degrees.

Thomas Marshall Graduate Student Award

Designed to encourage students to become active members of ASTR by helping them meet the expenses of attending the ASTR annual meeting.

Phi Kappa Phi Love of Learning Research Grant

Love of Learning Awards help fund post-baccalaureate professional development for active Phi Kappa Phi members to include (but not be limited to): Graduate or professional studies, doctoral dissertations, continuing education, career development, travel related to teaching/research/learning, etc.

Acoustical Society of America Leo and Gabriella Beranek Scholarship in Architectural Acoustics and Noise Control

Supports graduate study in the fields of architectural acoustics and noise control.

Advanced Short-Term Research Opportunity (ASTRO) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory's highly selective ASTRO program offers challenging short-term research opportunities to students enrolled in Master's or Doctoral programs or to those holding a Master's degree in any of the STEM disciplines. Promotes and encourages scholarship in legal history, particularly in the colonial and early national periods of the United States. The Foundation has supported the publication of legal records as well as historical monographs.

American Translators Association Student Translation Award

Grant-in-aid to a student for a literary or sci-tech translation or translation-related project. Also includes support for attending ATA's Annual Conference

APERG Air Pollution and Research Grant

Research on air pollution, air quality, the atmosphere, or closely related field. PhD student or recipient. \$25,000 Grant, tuition waiver request. US Citizen, international student.

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

Multiple internships for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

APS Award for Outstanding Doctoral Thesis Research in Biological Physics

The American Physical Society (APS) with this award recognizes doctoral thesis research of outstanding quality and achievement in any area of experimental, computational, engineering, or theoretical Biological Physics, broadly construed, and encourages written and oral presentation of research results at the March APS meeting.

California State University - Chancellor's Doctoral Incentive Program (CDIP)

The goal of the California State University Chancellor's Doctoral Incentive Program (CDIP) is to increase the number of faculty with the qualifications, motivation, and skills needed to teach the diverse students of the CSU. CDIP prepares promising doctoral students for CSU faculty positions by providing financial support, mentorship by CSU faculty and professional development and grant resources. It is the largest program of its kind in the U.S.

Center for LGBTQ Studies (CLAGS) - Scholar in Residence Fellowship

CLAGS offers three significant fellowship and award opportunities for exceptional student advocates and researchers in the area of LGBTQ studies.

Coordinating Council for Women in History (CCWH) Awards

CCWH offers various awards for graduate students, including a \$1,000 dissertation award and a \$1,000 award for research related to race and gender.

Fellowship for ROC Students Abroad Council of Writing Program Administrators Research Grant

The Council of Writing Program Administrators invites proposals for research projects investigating issues/practices in writing program administration. Awards are offered in a general and a targeted research category.

Florida Association of School Psychologists Graduate Studies Award

Awards to support students working in the area of school psychology.

Florida Nurses Association Scholarships & Grants

The Florida Nurses Foundation exists to promote nursing and the delivery of healthcare through the advancement of research, education, and practice.

Florida-Mexico Institute Out-of-State Tuition Waiver

The Florida-Mexico Institute (FMI) promotes commercial, cultural, and educational linkages between Florida and Mexico. The FMI provides out-of-state tuition waivers to eligible students.

Foundation for Community Association Research Byron Hanke Fellowship

Fellowship available to graduate students working on topics related to community associations.

Kenneth and Barbara Starks Plant Resistance to Insects Graduate Student Award

The award recognizes innovative research by a graduate student in entomology or plant breeding/genetics whose work contributes significantly to knowledge of plant resistance to insects

Huntington Library/Western History Association - Martin Ridge Fellowship

This one-month fellowship supports research using materials housed at the Huntington Library in San Marino, CA, in the study of the North American West as both a frontier and a region. Recipients of the fellowship are expected to be in continuous residence at the Huntington for one month.

Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs, and Administration (NASPAA)

NASPAA Staats Emerging Scholars Award

Recognizes up to three PhD candidates who will be job-seeking for an academic position in the coming academic year. Candidates will be selected to present a paper at the annual conference in front of national and international public service education leaders who make hiring decisions.

NASPAA Dissertation Award

Recognizes significant research completed by a PhD candidate in public policy, affairs, or administration.

Phi Kappa Phi Love of Learning Research Grant

Love of Learning Awards help fund post-baccalaureate professional development for active Phi Kappa Phi members to include (but not be limited to): Graduate or professional studies, doctoral dissertations, continuing education, career development, travel related to teaching/research/learning, etc.

July (Doctoral)

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Fellowship

Fellowship for graduate students currently studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields must demonstrate the potential to advance understanding in the relationship between theology and the principles of the free and virtuous society.

AIS Junior Research Fellowships

Specifically designed to enable doctoral candidates to pursue dissertation research in India.

American Heraldry Society - William Barton Graduate Scholarship

Barton Scholarships support master's and doctoral students conducting research on heraldry (coats of arms, seals, badges and related symbols) within the United States and its territories and possessions. Eligible disciplines include, but are not limited to, history, literature, law, anthropology, sociology, political science/government, archaeology, art history, architecture and design, and communication studies.

Dwight David Eisenhower Transportation Fellowship Program

For master's and PhD students with at least one academic year left. Supported fields include engineering, life sciences, physical sciences, social sciences, arts and architecture, information systems, management, public affairs, biology, chemistry, computer science, environmental science, math, physics, business, economics, aviation, logistics management.

EMDR Foundation - Sandra Wilson Memorial Doctoral Dissertation Grant for Mental Health Research

Grants support dissertation expenses related to research to study the effectiveness of Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) in one of the following priority areas: advancing evidence based practice, addressing the global burden of trauma, and building clinical evidence. These priorities apply to research across the lifespan. The grant offers support for one year.

Leakey Foundation Research Grants

Advanced doctoral students whose research is relevant to human origins and evolution may apply for awards between \$3,000 and \$15,000.

Meredith P. Crawford Fellowship

Fellowship provides a one-time stipend to a doctoral candidate in Industrial-Organizational Psychology.

NSF Linguistics Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Awards (Ling-DDRI)

The National Science Foundation uses these grants to fund promising dissertation research supporting basic science in the domain of human language, encompassing investigations of the grammatical properties of individual human languages, and of natural language in general.

Korean American Scholarship Fund (KASF)

Korean-American students attending a graduate or professional school in the through Regional Chapters. Students with a Korean heritage studying in the United States regardless of citizenship status (including Korean Nationals) are eligible to apply. The scholarships offer support for one year.

Hospitality Industry Network

NEWH ICON of Industry Scholarship

A \$7,500 scholarship awarded to students pursuing careers in a field similar to that of a given year's selected NEWH ICON (changes annually).

NEWH Fabric Innovations Legacy Scholarship

This \$10,000 scholarship is open to hospitality management or interior design students in NY or FL.

American Society for Theater Research

Thomas Marshall Graduate Student Award

Designed to encourage students to become active members of ASTR by helping them meet the expenses of attending the ASTR annual meeting.

Helen Krich Chinoy Dissertation Fellowship

The total award amount of \$3000 is typically divided into three equal awards. It is intended to assist Ph.D. candidates with the expenses of travel to national and international collections to conduct research projects connected with their dissertations.

NSF Biological Anthropology Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grant

The Biological Anthropology Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grant program (BA-DDRIG) supports PhD projects to promote scientific research, advance theory, facilitate education and training, and enhance the capabilities of current and future researchers.

Women Chemists Committee/Eli Lilly Travel Awards

Need-based grants offered to graduate and postdoctoral women chemists to travel and present the results of their research at scientific meetings.

Smithsonian Institution—STRI Short-Term Fellowship Program

Provides support for graduate students and introduces them to tropical research. These fellowships enable selected candidates to work in and explore research possibilities at STRI.

Internships with the Middle East Program

The Program concentrates on long-term developments and issues that impact stability and growth in the region and its relations with the United States. The Middle East Program's meetings, conferences and reports assess the policy implications of regional developments, the Middle East's role in the international arena, American interests in the region, strategic threats to and from the states, and the future prospects of the region's energy resources.

Institute of Electrical and Electronic Engineers (IEEE) - Electron Device Society (EDS)

- PhD Student Fellowship

One year fellowships are awarded to promote, recognize, and support PhD level study and research within the Electron Devices Society's field of interest.

August (Doctoral)

American Heart Association Predoctoral Fellowship

For research broadly related to cardiovascular function and disease and stroke, or to related clinical, basic science, bioengineering or biotechnology, and public health problems, including multidisciplinary efforts.

NSF MMS Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grant (DDRI)

The National Science Foundation's Methodology, Measurement, & Statistics DDRI grant program funds doctoral research that develops innovative analytical and statistical methods and models for the Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences.

New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Conserve Wildlife Matching Grant

With funding from the Conserve Wildlife License Plate renewal fund, the NJDEP Division of Fish and Wildlife's Endangered and Nongame Species Program (ENSP) offers small matching grants for one-year projects that advance nongame wildlife conservation and education.

Higher Education Research Experience (HERE) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory HERE program provides opportunities for current graduate students to participate in research and related technical activities under the mentor-ship of world-class scientists. Graduate students in all STEM fields may apply for full-time or part-time experiences of flexible duration. Participants receive a bi-weekly stipend and a housing allowance. Program requirements may include attending enrichment and professional development activities as well as the development and presentation of a deliverable such as a written research report, research poster, or formal presentation.

Advanced Short-Term Research Opportunity (ASTRO) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory's highly selective ASTRO program offers challenging short-term research opportunities to students enrolled in Master's or Doctoral programs or to those holding a Master's degree in any of the STEM disciplines. Participants conduct research in one of the laboratory's current programs with a senior mentor for 3 to 12 months and receive a monthly stipend. Participants may also attend professional development events and request funding for relocation, conference travel, and publication fees.

Computational Science & Technology Advanced Research Studies (C-STARS) Program

This paid research opportunity is open to all current graduate students with at least a 3.5 GPA who have received a Master's degree within the past five years. Participants spend usually 12 months at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) in Oak Ridge, Tennessee conducting computational research. Participants receive a bi-weekly stipend, housing or travel reimbursements, conference travel costs, and any publication-related fees.

Episcopal Church Foundation (ECF) - Fellowship Partners Program

Fellowship support to emerging scholars in an area where the Episcopal Church needs to develop expertise. The fellowship offers support for one year, renewable for up to three years total.

Fermi National Accelerator Laboratory - Universities Research Association, Inc. (URA) - Visiting Scholars Program

The program support visits by researchers from URA member institutions to work at Fermilab for periods of up to one year. Visits can range from attendance at Fermilab conferences and summer schools to year-long stays at the Lab. Support provided by the program may include the following: travel and local lodging expenses during a series of short visits OR

salary support and round trip travel expenses for an extended visit. Awards are for up to one year.

Harvard University - Society of Fellows Program

Fellowships support dissertation completion and postdoctoral research in any department of the University. Fellows undertake sustained projects of research or other original work, or may devote their time to the acquisition of accessory disciplines, so as to prepare themselves for the investigation of problems lying between conventional fields.

Houtan Foundation - Graduate Scholarship in Iranian Studies The Houtan Foundation offers scholarship to students from all origins – Iranian and non-Iranian – who have high academic performance and proven interest in promoting Iran's great culture, heritage, language, and civilization.

John William Miller Fellowship Fund - Research Fellowships

The John William Miller Fellowship Fund supports book-length projects that engage with the theories of philosopher John William Miller.

Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences Nicholl Fellowships in Screenwriting

Fellows are expected to complete a feature-length screenplay during the fellowship year.

Congressional Papers Section (CPS) Pre-Conference Scholarship

Financial assistance to attend the CPR pre-conference at the Society of American Archivists Annual Meeting.

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

Short Term Research Grants

Awards for doctoral candidates with research projects that make a stay in Germany essential.

German Studies Research Grant

Grants to highly-qualified graduate students who are nominated by their department/program chairs.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research that contributes to the Foundation's mission of supporting basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to provide significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

Society for Male Reproduction and Urology Traveling Scholars Award Program

Provides an opportunity for trainees to learn more about the field of male infertility by attending educational activities at the annual meeting of the American Society for Reproductive Medicine (ASRM).

The Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History Fellowship

The Institute provides annual short-term research fellowships to doctoral candidates, college and university faculty at every rank, and independent scholars working in the field of American history. Fellows may conduct research within the archival holdings of any institution located in the five boroughs of New York City.

American Hotel and Lodging Educational Fund Graduate Scholarship

Open to hospitality management graduate students as well as graduate students who have an undergraduate hospitality management degree or at least four years' employment in the industry.

Albert M. Greenfield Foundation Dissertation Fellowship

Supports dissertation research in residence at the Library Company on any subject relevant to its collections.

Christine Mirzayan Science and Technology Policy Graduate Fellowship Program

Spend 12 weeks at the National Academies in Washington, DC, learning about science and technology policy and the role that scientists and engineers play in advising the nation.

June (Travel)

College of Physicians of Philadelphia - Wood Institute for the History of Medicine - Travel Grants

The F.C. Wood Institute for the History of Medicine at the College of Physicians of Philadelphia offers grants to cover travel and lodging expenses for researchers who wish to use the College's collection of texts, manuscripts, archives, images, artifacts, and specimens in the history of medicine for short-term research (1 to 2 weeks).

DOE Office of Science Graduate Student Research (SCGSR) Program

The U.S. Department of Energy's SCGSR Program prepares PhD students for science, technology, engineering, or mathematics (STEM) careers critically important to the DOE's Office of Science mission by providing dissertation opportunities at DOE laboratories.

International Ocean Discovery Program Expedition

The International Ocean Discovery Program (IODP) is an international research collaboration that coordinates seagoing expeditions to study the history of the Earth recorded in sediments and rocks beneath the ocean floor. The JOIDES Resolution Science Operator (JRSO) operates the scientific drillship JOIDES Resolution on behalf of the National Science Foundation.

Women Chemists Committee/Eli Lilly Travel Awards

Need-based grants offered to graduate and postdoctoral women chemists to travel and present the results of their research at scientific meetings.

Smithsonian Institution—STRI Short-Term Fellowship Program

Provides support for graduate students and introduces them to tropical research. These fellowships enable selected candidates to work in and explore research possibilities at STRI.

July (Travel)

American Society for Theatre Research (ASTR) - Helen Krich Chinok Dissertation Travel Fellowship

The Helen Krich Chinoy Dissertation Fellowship is intended to assist Ph.D. candidates with the expenses of travel to national and international collections to conduct research projects connected with their dissertations.

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) German Studies Research Grant

Specialized DAAD program offers German Studies Research Grants to highly-qualified undergraduate and graduate students who are nominated by their department/program chairs. The grant may be used for short-term research (one to two months) in Germany.

National Museum of the American Indian Internship Program

Fall internships for students interested in the museum profession and related fields.

Wolf Trap Internships

12-week program to foster the next generation of arts leaders (flexible start and end dates) in Washington, D.C.

Society for the History of Technology Travel Grant

Designed to attend the SHOT conference. Open to individuals giving a paper at the annual meeting. Priority is given to scholars who address women, gender, race, ethnicity, and/or difference in the history of technology.

American Society for Theater Research

Thomas Marshall Graduate Student Award

Designed to encourage students to become active members of ASTR by helping them meet the expenses of attending the ASTR annual meeting.

Helen Krich Chinoy Dissertation Fellowship

Intended to assist Ph.D. candidates with the expenses of travel to national and international collections to conduct research projects connected with their dissertations.

Caucus for Women in Statistics Travel Award

The Caucus for Women in Statistics (CWS) travel awards partially support attending a professional meeting, such as the Joint Statistical Meeting (JSM). At least two awards in the amount of \$500 each are anticipated. The selection will be based on both merits and financial need.

Dwight D. Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum - Travel Grant

Travel grants for scholars for use of primary sources housed at the library in such fields as history, government, economics, communications, and international affairs.

Neotropical Grassland Conservancy (NGC) Student Grant Program

The foundation's mission is promoting the conservation of savannas, gallery forests, wetlands, and associated ecosystems in Central and South America. The Student Grant Program provides funds for basic needs. Open to Latin American students enrolled in M.S. or Ph.D. programs in U.S. or South American universities.

University Research Association Visiting Scholars Program

Funding for visits to work at Fermilab for up to one year.

Institute for Humane Studies Conference and Research Grant

Grants awarded to graduate students who are advancing the principles of freedom through their careers to present at academic or professional conferences, travel to academic job interviews on a campus or at a conference, travel to archives or libraries for research, or participate in career-development seminars.

KOSMOS Summer University Fellowship

The KOSMOS Summer University provides Humboldt-University scientists and international guests with a solid foundation for developing a research project over a period of up to one year. This time period concludes with a KOSMOS Summer University carried out in cooperation with at least two international universities.

Luso-American USA@PT Grants

Short-term research grants to provide researchers with a fruitful stay in Portugal. Supplies awardees with the required means to develop their work and provides for their travel and accommodation expenses.
