Neotropical Grassland Conservancy (NGC) Student Grant Program

August 1, 2019

The foundation's mission is promoting the conservation of savannas, gallery forests, wetlands, and associated ecosystems in Central and South America. The Student Grant Program provides funds for basic needs such as transportation, lodging, meals and consumable field supplies. Open to Latin American students enrolled in M.S. or Ph.D. programs in U.S. or South American universities.

University Research Association Visiting Scholars Program

August 26, 2019

Funding for visits to work at Fermilab for up to one year.

Christine Mirzayan Science and Technology Policy Graduate Fellowship Program

September 6, 2019

Spend 12 weeks in winter/spring at the National Academies in Washington, DC, learning about science and technology policy and the role that scientists and engineers play in advising the nation. Applicants become part of a National Academies committee, board, or unit where they are assigned to a mentor and learn about the world of science and technology policy.

Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation USArtists International Grants

September 7, 2019

Funding for American artists to perform at cultural festivals/art marketplaces around the globe.

Gerald R. Ford Presidential Foundation Research Travel Grants

September 15, 2019

Grants up to \$2,200 in support of research in the holdings of the Gerald R. Ford Library. The grant may be used to defray travel costs and living expenses.

Nuclear Engineering Science Laboratory Synthesis (NESLS) Program

September 15, 2019

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory NESLS Program provides current undergraduates and graduates with the opportunity to conduct research and participate in associated activities related to nuclear engineering. Participants receive in-depth training and have flexible appointments in Spring, Summer, or Fall. Participants have a minimum 10-week stay either full-time or part-time and receive a weekly stipend, housing allowance, and other benefits.

German Chancellor Fellowship for Prospective Leaders

September 15, 2019

Grants support graduate students wishing to undertake independent projects at a German institution for one year, network with other prospective leaders from abroad, and explore solutions to the global issues of our times.

Women Chemists Committee/Eli Lilly Travel Awards

September 15, 2019

Need-based grants offered to graduate and postdoctoral women chemists to travel and present the results of their research at scientific meetings.

American Councils for International Education

October 1, 2019

American Councils Title VIII Research Scholar Program

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake three to nine consecutive months of independent research in one of numerous countries within Eurasia or Eastern Europe, including Russia. Award amounts typically range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. The program's interests lie in research important to U.S. policy makers.

American Councils Title VIII Research & Language Training Program (CRLT)

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake research and language study for three to nine months in a number of countries in Eurasia and Eastern Europe, including Russia. Typical awards range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. Project proposals should deal with issues relevant to U.S. policy makers.

Harry S. Truman Library Research Grant

October 1, 2019

Research Grants of up to \$2,500 are awarded twice annually to offset the cost of conducting research at the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum.

St John's College Research Fellowships

October 3, 2019 (anticipated)

Research fellowships intended for outstanding researchers early in their careers (including graduate students) to carry out independent research in a stimulating and supportive academic environment.

Fulbright Study/Research Grants and English Teaching Assistantships

October 8, 2019

The Fulbright Program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State and is the largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students to undertake graduate study and advanced research worldwide or to teach English abroad.

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations

October 15, 2019

W. Stull Holt Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of travel necessary to conduct research on a significant dissertation project dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Travel (Continued)

Lawrence Gelfand – Armin Rappaport – Walter LeFeber Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of dissertation research travel for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Bemis grants.

Samuel Flagg Bemis Dissertation Research Grant

Fellowship to help defray the costs of domestic or international travel necessary to conduct research on significant scholarly projects for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber grants.

Smithsonian Institution—STRI Short-Term Fellowship Program

October 15, 2019

Provides support for graduate students and introduces them to tropical research. These fellowships enable selected candidates to work in and explore research possibilities at STRI.

Naval Research Enterprise Internship Program

October 31, 2019 (anticipated)

Summer internships for students to participate in research at a Department of Navy laboratory.

Wolf Trap Internships

November 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Spring, Summer, and Fall internships available to foster the next generation of arts leaders. 12-week program with flexible start and end dates in Washington, DC.

Dumbarton Oaks Research Library and Collection

November 1, 2019

Summer Fellowship

Fellowships for Byzantine, Pre-Columbian, or Garden and Landscape scholars on any level of advancement beyond the first year of graduate (post-baccalaureate) study.

Junior Fellowship

Fellowships for students who have fulfilled all preliminary requirements for the PhD and will be working on a dissertation at Dumbarton Oaks under the direction of a faculty member at their own university.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

November 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research. The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to provide significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

German Studies Research Grant

Specialized DAAD program offers German Studies Research Grants to highly-qualified undergraduate and graduate students who are nominated by their department/program chairs. The grant may be used for short-term research (one to two months) in Germany.

Long Term Research Grants

Long-term research grants are awarded to highly qualified candidates who desire to conduct long-term research (7-10 months) or join a German doctoral program.

Program in China Studies Predissertation-Summer Travel Grants

November 7, 2019 (anticipated)

Pre-dissertation—summer travel grants, postdoctoral fellowships as well as collaborative reading-workshop grants available.

Critical Language Scholarship Program

November 15, 2019 (anticipated)

Part of a U.S. government effort to expand dramatically the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages. Languages Supported: Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Punjabi, Swahili, Turkish, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Chinese, Japanese, and Russian.

Leifur Eiríksson Foundation Scholarship Program

November 15, 2019 (anticipated)

For graduate research or study at universities in Iceland. Up to \$25,000 in project costs, including travel to and from the research or study site will be paid on the scholar's behalf.

Roosevelt Institute Research Grant

November 15, 2019

Funds are awarded for the sole purpose of helping to defray living, travel, and related expenses incurred while conducting research at the Roosevelt Library. The grants program is particularly designed to encourage younger scholars to expand our knowledge and understanding of the Roosevelt period.

National Museum of the American Indian Internship Program

November 20, 2019 (anticipated)

Internships are provided for students interested in the museum profession and related fields.

Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation USArtists International Grants

November 30, 2019 (anticipated)

Funding for American artists to perform at cultural festivals/art marketplaces around the globe.

Kress History of Art: Institutional Fellowship

November 30, 2019

Advanced training in European art history requires direct exposure to the object of study, prolonged access to key information resources such as libraries and photographic archives, the development of professional relationships with colleagues abroad, and sustained immersion in European cultures.

Luso-American USA@PT Grants

Deadline: Last day of each month

Short-term research grants to provide researchers with a fruitful stay in Portugal. Supplies awardees with the required means to develop their work and provides for their travel and accommodation expenses.

Institute for Humane Studies Conference and Research Grant

Deadline: Rolling, at least four weeks before activity for which you are seeking funding

Grants awarded to graduate students who are advancing the principles of freedom through their careers to present at academic or professional conferences, travel to academic job interviews on a campus or at a conference, travel to archives or libraries for research, or participate in career-development seminars.

Travel (Continued)

Institute for Humane Studies Conference and Research Grant

Deadline: Rolling, at least four weeks before activity for which you are seeking funding

Grants awarded to graduate students who are advancing the principles of freedom through their careers to present at academic or professional conferences, travel to academic job interviews on a campus or at a conference, travel to archives or libraries for research, or participate in career-development seminars.

Computational Science & Technology Advanced Research Studies (C-STARS) Program

Deadline: Rolling

This paid research opportunity is open to all current graduate students with at least a 3.5 GPA who have received a Master's degree within the past five years. Participants spend usually 12 months at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) in Oak Ridge, Tennessee conducting computational research in areas that support ORNL missions. As of Spring/Summer 2019, there are current openings in software engineering, geographic information systems, and life and medical sciences database research. Participants have access to state-of-the-art laboratory equipment, professional development activities, presentation opportunities, and a large professional network. Participants receive a bi-weekly stipend, housing or travel reimbursements, conference travel costs, and any publication-related fees. Graduate students may participate in part-time or full-time appointments.

Higher Education Research Experience (HERE) Program

Deadline: Rolling

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory HERE program provides opportunities for current graduate students to participate in research and related technical activities under the mentorship of world-class scientists. Graduate students in all STEM fields may apply for full-time or part-time experiences of flexible duration. Participants receive a bi-weekly stipend and a housing allowance. Program requirements may include attending enrichment and professional development activities as well as the development and presentation of a deliverable such as a written research report, research poster, or formal presentation.

Pediatric Endocrinology Nursing Society Academic Education Scholarship

September 1, 2019

Implemented as a means of helping PENS to meet its goal of advancing the art and science of pediatric endocrine nursing. The PENS is committed to increasing the knowledge base and enhancing the professional development of nurses in the field of pediatric endocrinology.

Conference on College Composition and Communication Research Initiative Grant

September 1, 2019

Grants for research related to literacy and writing in and out of formal education. The organization is also interested in research that can be addressed to scholars and the public.

Nuclear Engineering Science Laboratory Synthesis (NESLS) Program

September 15, 2019

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory NESLS Program provides current undergraduates and graduates with the opportunity to conduct research and participate in associated activities related to nuclear engineering. AHIMA Foundation

September 30, 2019

Veterans Scholarships

Scholarships for veterans and their spouses in Health Informatics and Information Management programs.

Merit Scholarships

\$2,000 award for students pursuing a Master's degree in areas related to Health Information Management (HIM) or Health Informatics Technology (HIT). One of the initiatives of AHIMA is to attract and support new talent in the HIM industry by improving educational opportunities for current and future HIM professionals through scholarships.

Craft Research Fund Graduate Research Grant

October 1, 2019

Grants to support research for a master's thesis related to U.S. studio craft.

WIIT Scholarship Program

October 1, 2019

Program is designed to provide financial assistance to further educational objectives of women who are interested in international development, international relations, international trade and economics, or international business.

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

October 1, 2019

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

National Academy of Sciences Sigma Xi Grants-in-Aid of Research

October 1, 2019

The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from the National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision-related research. Students may use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or to purchase non-standard laboratory equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

National Art Education Foundation Grant

October 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Grant opportunities for those working in art education.

Master's (Continued)

National Strength and Conditioning Association Grants and Scholarships

October 15, 2019

Grants and Scholarships for students researching questions related to strength training and/or conditioning.

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Fellowship

October 15, 2019

Fellowship for graduate students currently studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields with the potential to advance understanding in the relationship between theology and the principles of a free and virtuous society. Such principles include recognition of human dignity, the importance of the rule of law, limited government, religious liberty, and freedom in economic life.

Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

October 15, 2019 (anticipated)

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

Ludo Frevel Crystallography Scholarships

October 17, 2019 (anticipated)

Scholarships for graduate students enrolled in graduate degree programs with major interest in crystallography.

ACI Foundation Fellowship and Scholarship

October 18, 2019 (anticipated)

Scholarships for eligible graduate students whose studies relate to concrete.

NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP)

October 23, 2019 (anticipated)

The NSF-GRFP provides three years of support for the graduate education of individuals who have demonstrated their potential for significant achievements in science and engineering research. Undergraduate seniors and 1st or 2nd year graduate students are eligible to apply. Students cannot have previously earned a Master's degree. Deadlines vary depending on area of study.

Hertz Foundation

October 24, 2019 (anticipated)

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for first year graduate students willing to make skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency.

Women Divers Hall of Fame Scholarship

October 31, 2019 (anticipated)

The Women Divers Hall of Fame (WDHOF) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to honoring and raising awareness of the contributions of outstanding women divers. WDHOF provides educational, mentorship, financial, and career opportunities to the diving community throughout the world. Each year, WDHOF awards scholarships and training grants that provide financial and educational support to individuals of all ages, particularly those who are preparing for professional careers that involve diving.

Master's (Continued)

American Society of Testing and Materials Project Grant

October 31, 2019

ASTM International offers a limited number of \$500 grants to university students to help with student design projects that contain an ASTM International standards component.

American Cancer Society Graduate Scholarships in Cancer Nursing

November 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Supports graduate students pursuing a master's degree in cancer nursing or doctorate of nursing practice (DNP). Awards may be for two years, with stipend of \$10,000 per year.

Roy Scrivner Memorial Research Grant

November 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Grant for empirical and applied research focused on lesbian, gay, and bisexual family psychology and lesbian, gay and bisexual family therapy.

Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans

November 1, 2019 (anticipated)

New Americans, immigrants or the children of immigrants, who are pursuing graduate school in the United States.

Rockefeller Archives Center Grant

November 1, 2019

The Rockefeller Archive Center's competitive programs are designed to provide assistance to scholars who need to visit the Rockefeller Archive Center in Sleepy Hollow, NY to conduct research in its collections.

Department of Transportation Outstanding Student of the Year Award

November 3, 2019 (anticipated)

Each year at the annual winter meeting of the Transportation Research Board, the Department honors the most outstanding student from each participating University Transportation Center (UTC) for his/her achievements and promise for future contributions to the transportation field. Students of the year are selected based on their accomplishments in such areas as technical merit and research, academic performance, professionalism, and leadership.

GEM MS Engineering Fellowship Program

November 13, 2019

GEM Fellows are provided practical engineering summer work experiences through an employer sponsor and a portable academic year fellowship of tuition, fees, and a stipend which may be used at any participating GEM Member University where the GEM Fellow is admitted.

Arthur C. Pike Scholarship in Meteorology

November 14, 2019

A scholarship from the National Weather Association for students majoring in meteorology.

Internships with the Middle East Program

November 15, 2019 (anticipated)

The Program concentrates on long-term developments and how such issues impact stability and growth in the region and its relations with the United States. The Middle East Program's meetings, conferences and reports assess the policy implications of regional developments (political, economic, and social), the Middle East's role in the international arena, American interests in the region, strategic threats to and from the regional states, and the role and future prospects of the region's energy resources.

Roosevelt Institute Research Grant

November 15, 2019

Funds are awarded for the sole purpose of helping to defray living, travel, and related expenses incurred while conducting research at the Roosevelt Library. The grants program is particularly designed to encourage younger scholars to expand our knowledge and understanding of the Roosevelt period.

Knowles Science Teaching Foundation Fellowship

November 25, 2019 (anticipated)

Teaching fellowships for those who commit to teaching mathematics or science in grades 9-12 as their primary career.

Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Science Policy Fellowship

November 27, 2019 (anticipated)

The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services offers an outstanding opportunity for a Science Policy Fellow. The Fellow will be a critical member of the Science Advisory team that works across the department to foster cutting edge, interdisciplinary studies under the guidance of the department's Deputy Commissioner and Chief Science Officer. With a home office in the state's capitol building in beautiful north central Florida (or other Florida sites as requested), the Fellow will have a selection of a wide variety of hands-on projects throughout the state, traveling as little or as much as his/her interests dictate.

National Physical Science Consortium Fellowships in Science, Engineering, and Math

November 30, 2019 (anticipated)

Richard A. Horovitz Fund for Professional Development

Rolling deadline

To be eligible for this scholarship, one must be a citizen of a sub-Saharan African country; be a graduate student, researcher, or artist enrolled at an accredited U.S. university or institution; specialize in the humanities or social sciences; demonstrate academic achievement and financial need; and not be funded by an established IIE grant.

P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education

Deadline: Apply 8 weeks prior to the start of the term for which the grant is requested

One-time need based grants for women who are citizens or legal permanent residents of the U.S. or Canada for use in completing a degree or certification necessary for improving or gaining skills leading to employment.

Segal AmeriCorps Education Award

Deadlines vary

The AmeriCorps Education Award is a post-service benefit received by individuals who complete terms of national service in approved AmeriCorps programs, such as AmeriCorps VISTA, AmeriCorps NCCC, or AmeriCorps State and National.

Advanced Short-Term Research Opportunity (ASTRO) Program

Deadline: Rolling

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory's highly selective ASTRO program offers challenging short-term research opportunities to students enrolled in Master's or Doctoral programs or to those holding a Master's degree in any of the STEM disciplines. Participants conduct research in one of the laboratory's current programs with a senior mentor for 3 to 12 months and receive a monthly stipend. The program encompasses a broad spectrum of interdisciplinary interests including work in ethics, equity, governance, and policy issues, and in medical science.

American Heart Association Predoctoral Fellowship

August 14, 2019

For research broadly related to cardiovascular function and disease and stroke, or to related clinical, basic science, bioengineering or biotechnology, and public health problems, including multidisciplinary efforts.

SHRM Foundation Graduate Student Scholarship

August 15, 2019

Scholarships graduate students in programs with an emphasis area in HR or an HR-related program (such as business, psychology or labor relations).

NSF MMS Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grant (DDRI)

August 29, 2019

The National Science Foundation's Methodology, Measurement, & Statistics DDRI grant program funds doctoral research that develops innovative analytical and statistical methods and models for the Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences.

American Psychological Association Dissertation Research Award

September 1, 2019

The purpose of the APA Science Directorate's Dissertation Research Award is to assist science-oriented doctoral students of psychology with research costs.

Pediatric Endocrinology Nursing Society Academic Education Scholarship

September 1, 2019

Implemented as a means of helping PENS to meet its goal of advancing the art and science of pediatric endocrine nursing. The PENS is committed to increasing the knowledge base and enhancing the professional

development of nurses in the field of pediatric endocrinology.

Romance Writers of America Academic Research Grant

September 1, 2019

Up to \$5,000 to develop and support academic research devoted to genre romance novels, writers, and readers. The ultimate goal of the proposals should be significant publication in major journals or as a monograph from an academic press. RWA does not fund creative work (such as novels or films). Grant is open to dissertation candidates who have completed all course work and qualifying exams.

PhRMA Pre Doctoral Fellowships

September 1, 2019 (Health Outcomes deadline: February 1, 2020)

Fellowships for students who expect to complete the Ph.D. in two years or less from the time the fellowship begins. Fellowships are offered in five areas: Health Outcomes, Informatics, Pharmaceuticals, Pharmacology/Toxicology (

September 1, 2019

September 6, 2019

The Accounting Doctoral Scholars (ADS) Program funds individuals with recent public accounting experience in audit or tax to earn a doctorate in accounting with a tax or audit emphasis. Degree payments total \$40,000.

NSF Science of Science & Innovation Policy Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grant (SciSIP-DDRIG)

September 9, 2019

The National Science Foundation uses this program to fund dissertation research that will advance the scientific basis of science and innovation policy. The program funds research to develop models, analytical tools, data, and metrics that can be applied to science policy. Awards fund research necessities not usually available at a university, such as significant data-gathering projects off-site. This funding does not support cost-of-living, stipends, or tuition.

GADE Student Award for Social Work Research

September 15, 2019

The Group for the Advancement of Doctoral Education in Social Work Student Award for Social Work Research is given to an individual doctoral student or collaborative group of students whose published (or in press) scholarship advances scientific inquiry in social work or social welfare. The research should serve as a model for scientific rigor, and show high potential to impact social work practice, policy, or research.

Nuclear Engineering Science Laboratory Synthesis (NESLS) Program

September 15, 2019

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory NESLS Program provides current undergraduates and graduates with the opportunity to conduct research and participate in associated activities related to nuclear engineering. Participants receive in-depth training and have flexible appointments in Spring, Summer, or Fall. Participants have a minimum 10-week stay either full-time or part-time and receive a weekly stipend, housing allowance, and other benefits.

AERA-MET Dissertation Grant Program

September 25, 2019

Support for graduate students in education research to conduct secondary data analysis using the Measures of Effective Teaching (MET) Longitudinal Database.

AHIMA Foundation

September 30, 2019

Merit Scholarships

\$2,000 award for students pursuing a Master's degree in areas related to Health Information Management (HIM) or Health Informatics Technology (HIT). One of the initiatives of AHIMA is to attract and support new talent in the HIM industry by improving student educational opportunities.

Veterans Scholarships

Scholarships for veterans and their spouses in Health Informatics and Information Management programs.

Dissertation Support

Support for doctoral students who are at the ABD stage.

WIIT Scholarship Program

October 1, 2019

Program is designed to provide financial assistance to further educational objectives of women who are interested in international development, international relations, international trade and economics, or international business.

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

October 1, 2019

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

National Academy of Sciences Sigma Xi Grants-in-Aid of Research

October 1, 2019

The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from the National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision-related research. Students may use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or to purchase non-standard laboratory equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

National Art Education Foundation Grant

October 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Grant opportunities for those working in art education.

K. Patricia Cross Future Leaders Award

October 1, 2019 (anticipated)

Recognizes doctoral students who show exemplary promise as future leaders of higher education, who demonstrate a commitment to developing academic and civic responsibility in themselves and others, and whose work reflects a strong emphasis on teaching and learning. Student must be nominated by a faculty member or administrator.

Doctoral (Continued)

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake three to nine consecutive months of independent research in one of numerous countries within Eurasia or Eastern Europe, including Russia. Award amounts typically range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. The program's interests lie in research important to U.S. policy makers.

American Councils Title VIII Research & Language Training Program (CRLT)

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake research and language study for three to nine months in a number of countries in Eurasia and Eastern Europe, including Russia. Typical awards range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. Project proposals should deal with issues relevant to U.S. policy makers.

American Water Works Association Academic Achievement Award

October 1, 2019

Recognizes contributions to the field of public water supply. All master's theses and doctoral dissertations relevant to the water supply industry.

National Academy of Education/Spencer Dissertation Fellowship

October 3, 2019

The Dissertation Fellowship Program seeks to encourage a new generation of scholars from a wide range of disciplines and professional fields to undertake research relevant to the improvement of education. These \$27,500 fellowships support individuals whose dissertations show potential for bringing fresh and constructive perspectives to the history, theory, analysis, or practice of formal or informal education anywhere in the world.

American Academy of Audiology Student Summer Research Fellowship

October 5, 2019 (anticipated)

The purpose of this summer research fellowship is to expose students who are interested in research or wishing to pursue a career in research to a stimulating research environment under the guidance of a mentor.
