Master's

September

Conference on College Composition and Communication Research Initiative Grant

Grants for research related to literacy and writing in and out of formal education. The organization is also interested in research that can be addressed to scholars and the public.

American Institute for Economic Research Harwood Visiting Research Fellowships

Fellowships for visiting scholars including professors, post-doctoral fellows, PhD students, and masters students. Selected fellows are encouraged to join us at our campus in Great Barrington for the majority of their fellowship. AIER provides visiting scholars with a \$250/week living stipend and lunch during most work days. A travel stipend of \$750 is also provided for fellowships lasting 10 weeks or more (\$1500 for those outside of the US & Canada).

October

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

National Academy of Sciences Sigma Xi Grants-in-Aid of Research

The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from the National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision-related research. Students may use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or to purchase non-standard laboratory equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

National Art Education Foundation Grant

Grant opportunities for those working in art education.

National Strength and Conditioning Association Grants and Scholarships

Grants and Scholarships for students researching questions related to strength training and/or conditioning.

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Fellowship

Fellowship for graduate students currently studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields with the potential to advance understanding in the relationship between theology and the principles of a free and virtuous society. Such principles include recognition of human dignity, the importance of the rule of law, limited government, religious liberty, and freedom in economic life.

Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

Ludo Frevel Crystallography Scholarships

Scholarships for graduate students enrolled in graduate degree programs with major interest in crystallography.

ACI Foundation Fellowship and Scholarship

Scholarships for eligible graduate students whose studies relate to concrete.

NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP)

The NSF-GRFP provides three years of support for the graduate education of individuals who have demonstrated their potential for significant achievements in science and engineering research. Undergraduate seniors and 1st or 2nd year graduate students are eligible to apply. Students cannot have previously earned a Master's degree. Deadlines vary depending on area of study.

Fulbright Study/Research Grants and English Teaching Assistantships

The Fulbright Program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State and is the largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students to undertake graduate study and advanced research worldwide or to teach English abroad.

Hertz Foundation

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for first year graduate students in STEM fields willing to make their skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency.

Women Divers Hall of Fame Scholarship

The Women Divers Hall of Fame (WDHOF) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to honoring and raising awareness of the contributions of outstanding women divers. WDHOF provides educational, mentorship, financial, and career opportunities to the diving community throughout the world. Each year, WDHOF awards scholarships and training grants that provide financial and educational support to individuals of all ages, particularly those who are preparing for professional careers that involve diving.

American Water Works Association Academic Achievement Award

Recognizes contributions to the field of public water supply. All master's theses and doctoral dissertations relevant to the water supply industry.

Justin G. Schiller Prize for Bibliographical Work on Pre-20th Century Children's Books

Encourages scholarship in the bibliography of historical children's books. Works put into nomination, which must be in English, may concentrate on any children's book printed before the year 1901 in any country.

American Nephrology Nurses Association Education Scholarships and Grants
Support for members in their pursuit of higher education as well as grants for clinical research projects and patient or staff education programs.

Craft Research Fund Graduate Research Grant
Grants to support research for a master’s thesis related to U.S. studio craft.

American Cancer Society Graduate Scholarships in Cancer Nursing
Supports graduate students pursuing a master’s degree in cancer nursing or doctorate of nursing practice (DNP). Awards may be for two years, with stipend of \$10,000 per year.

Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans
New Americans, immigrants or the children of immigrants, who are pursuing graduate school in the United States.

Sigma Xi Grants-in-Aid of Research
The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from the National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision-related research. Students may use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or to purchase non-standard laboratory equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

National Strength and Conditioning Association Grants and Scholarships
Grants and Scholarships for students researching questions related to strength training and/or conditioning.

Sociologists for Women in Society Cheryl Allyn Miller Award
Award recognizes a sociology graduate student or a recent doctorate whose research or activism constitutes an outstanding contribution to the field of women and work

November (Master’s)

Department of Transportation Outstanding Student of the Year Award
Each year at the annual winter meeting of the Transportation Research Board, the Department honors the most outstanding student from each participating University Transportation Center (UTC) for his/her achievements and promise for future contributions to the transportation field. Students of the year are selected based on their accomplishments in such areas as technical merit and research, academic performance, professionalism, and leadership.

GEM MS Engineering Fellowship Program
GEM Fellows are provided practical engineering summer work experiences through an employersponsor and a portable academic year fellowship of tuition, fees, and a stipend which may be used at any participating GEM Member University where the GEM Fellow is admitted.

Arthur C. Pike Scholarship in Meteorology
A scholarship from the National Weather Association for students majoring in meteorology.

Medical Library Association Scholarship for Minority Students
A scholarship of up to \$5,000 is awarded annually by the Medical Library Association (MLA) to a student who shows excellence in scholarship and potential for accomplishment in health sciences librarianship.

Nuclear Engineering Science Laboratory Synthesis (NESLS) Program
The Oak Ridge National Laboratory NESLS Program provides current undergraduates and graduates with the opportunity to conduct research and participate in associated activities related to nuclear engineering. Participants receive in-depth training and have flexible appointments in Spring, Summer, or Fall. Participants have a minimum 10-week stay either full-time or part-time and receive a weekly stipend, housing allowance, and other benefits.

WIIT Scholarship Program
Program is designed to provide financial assistance to further educational objectives of women who are interested in international development, international relations, international trade and economics, or international business.

Rockefeller Archives Center Grant
The Rockefeller Archive Center’s competitive programs are designed to provide assistance to scholars who need to visit the Rockefeller Archive Center in Sleepy Hollow, NY to conduct research in its collections.

Critical Language Scholarship Program
Funds Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages, including Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Punjabi, Swahili, Turkish, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Chinese, Japanese, and Russian. CLS language programs are 8 to 10 week summer programs.

American Association of University Women

American Association of University Women International Fellowship
Awarded for full-time study or research in the United States to women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

American Association of University Women Career Development Grants
Funding to women who hold a bachelor’s degree and are preparing to advance or change careers or reenter the workforce. Primary consideration is given to women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in nontraditional fields.

December (Master’s)

SMART Fellowship through the Department of Defense (DOD)
December Supports undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics disciplines. The program aims to increase the number of civilian scientists and engineers working at DOD laboratories.

Association for Education Finance and Policy

Association for Education Finance Policy New Scholars Award

Supports significant research by master's and doctoral students whose research addresses education finance and policy.

Association for Education Finance Policy Jean Flanigan Outstanding Dissertation Award

Award in recognition of exemplary dissertation research in the area of education finance and policy.

National Physical Science Consortium Fellowships in Science, Engineering, and Math

Fellowships for graduate students in Astronomy, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geology, Materials Science, Mathematical Sciences, Physics, and related Engineering fields. Initial support may be for 2 to 3 years, or a full 6 years, depending on the employer-sponsor.

DAAD Language Course Grant

This scholarship program aims to help students and graduates improve their knowledge of the German language (general language, special language) and cultural knowledge of the country. DAAD offers grants to applicants from North American universities, who at the time of application have attained at least sophomore standing (second-year standing in Canada), to attend 8-week intensive language courses at leading institutes in Germany.

Neotropical Grassland Conservancy (NGC) Student Grant Program

The foundation's mission is promoting the conservation of savannas, gallery forests, wetlands, and associated ecosystems in Central and South America. The Student Grant Program provides funds for basic needs such as transportation, lodging, meals and consumable field supplies. Open to Latin American students enrolled in M.S. or Ph.D. programs in U.S. or South American universities.

Wilson Center Internships with the Middle East Program

The Program concentrates on long-term developments and how they impact stability and growth in the region and its relations with the U.S. The Program's meetings, conferences, and reports assess the policy implications of regional developments, the Middle East's role in the international arena, American interests in the region, strategic threats to and from the regional states, and the role and future prospects of the region's energy resources.

Women Techmakers Scholars Program

Awards for female graduate students in computer science, computer engineering, or closely related technical field. Includes support for the academic year and participation in the Annual Google Scholars' Retreat.

Florida Library Association Scholarships

Scholarships for students in Masters of Library Science graduate program.

American Water Works Association

Bryant L. Bench Scholarship

\$10,000 scholarship to support a master's student engaging in developing innovative solutions to the world's water challenges.

Hazen and Sawyer Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to support a student seeking a master's degree in the water science field.

HDR/Henry "Bud" Benjes Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to support a master's student seeking a degree in the water industry.

Larson Aquatic Research Support (LARS) Scholarship

Provides support for doctoral and master's students interested in fields of corrosion control, treatment and distribution of domestic and industrial water supplies, aquatic chemistry, and/or environmental chemistry. Awards are \$5,000 for master's students, \$7,000 for doctoral students.

Thomas R. Camp Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to support graduate students doing applied research in the drinking water field.

Holly A. Cornell Scholarship

\$7,500 scholarship to support outstanding female and/or minority master's students in pursuit of advanced training in the field of water supply and treatment

ARCADIS Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to support a master's or doctoral candidate seeking a degree in the water industry.

Dave Caldwell Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to benefit female and minority students pursuing an engineering degree in the drinking water field.

Woodard and Curran Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to support outstanding female and/or minority master's students in pursuit of training in the field of water treatment.

American Water Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship supports development of professionals interested in service to the water industry.

Point Foundation Scholarship

Scholarships empower promising LGBTQ students to achieve their full academic and leadership potential to make a significant impact on society.

P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education

One-time need based grants for women who are citizens or legal permanent residents of the U.S. or Canada for use in completing a degree or certification necessary for improving or gaining skills leading to employment.

Segal AmeriCorps Education Award

The AmeriCorps Education Award is a post-service benefit received by individuals who complete terms of national service in approved AmeriCorps programs, such as AmeriCorps VISTA, AmeriCorps NCCC, or AmeriCorps State and National.

Advanced Short-Term Research Opportunity (ASTRO) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory's highly selective ASTRO program offers challenging short-term research opportunities to students enrolled in Master's or Doctoral programs or to those holding a Master's degree in any of the STEM disciplines. Participants conduct research in one of the laboratory's current programs with a senior mentor for 3 to 12 months and receive a monthly stipend.

Knowles Science Teaching Foundation Fellowship

Teaching fellowships for those who commit to teaching mathematics or science in grades 9-12 as their primary career.

Doctoral

September

PhRMA Pre Doctoral Fellowships

Fellowships for students who expect to complete the Ph.D. in two years or less from the time the fellowship begins. Fellowships are offered in five areas: Health Outcomes, Informatics, Pharmaceuticals, Pharmacology/Toxicology

Conference on College Composition and Communication Research Initiative Grant

Grants for research related to literacy and writing in and out of formal education. The organization is also interested in research that can be addressed to scholars and the public.

AICPA Accounting Doctoral Scholars Program

The Accounting Doctoral Scholars (ADS) Program funds individuals with recent public accounting experience in audit or tax to earn a doctorate in accounting with a tax or audit emphasis. Degree payments total \$40,000.

Nuclear Engineering Science Laboratory Synthesis (NESLS) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory NESLS Program provides current undergraduates and graduates with the opportunity to conduct research and participate in associated activities related to nuclear engineering. Participants receive in-depth training and have flexible appointments in Spring, Summer, or Fall.

Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation USArtists International Grants

Funding for American artists to perform at cultural festivals/art marketplaces around the globe.

Gerald R. Ford Presidential Foundation Research Travel Grants

Grants up to \$2,200 in support of research in the holdings of the Gerald R. Ford Library. The grant may be used to defray travel costs and living expenses.

October

German Chancellor Fellowship for Prospective Leaders

Grants support graduate students wishing to undertake independent projects at a German institution for one year, network with other prospective leaders from abroad, and explore solutions to the global issues of our times.

Romance Writers of America Academic Research Grant

Up to \$5,000 to develop and support academic research devoted to genre romance novels, writers, and readers. The ultimate goal of the proposals should be significant publication in major journals or as a monograph from an academic press. RWA does not fund creative work (such as novels or films). Grant is open to dissertation candidates who have completed all course work and qualifying exams.

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

K. Patricia Cross Future Leaders Award

Recognizes doctoral students who show exemplary promise as future leaders of higher education, who demonstrate a commitment to developing academic and civic responsibility in themselves and others, and whose work reflects a strong emphasis on teaching and learning. Student must be nominated by a faculty member or administrator.

American Councils for International Education

American Councils Title VIII Research Scholar Program

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake three to nine consecutive months of independent research in one of numerous countries within Eurasia or Eastern Europe, including Russia. Award amounts typically range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. The program's interests lie in research important to U.S. policy makers.

American Councils Title VIII Research & Language Training Program (CRLT)

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake research and language study for three to nine months in a number of countries in Eurasia and Eastern Europe, including Russia. Typical awards range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. Project proposals should deal with issues relevant to U.S. policy makers.

Sociologists for Women in Society Cheryl Allyn Miller Award

Award recognizes a sociology graduate student, or a recent doctorate, whose research or activism constitutes an outstanding contribution to the field of women and work.

National Academy of Education/Spencer Dissertation Fellowship

The Dissertation Fellowship Program seeks to encourage a new generation of scholars from a wide range of disciplines and professional fields to undertake research relevant to the improvement of education. These \$27,500 fellowships support individuals whose dissertations show potential for bringing fresh and constructive perspectives to the history, theory, analysis, or practice of formal or informal education anywhere in the world.

World Politics and Statecraft Fellowship

Grants to support PhD dissertation research on American foreign policy, international relations, international security, strategic studies, area studies and diplomatic and military history. The fellowship’s objective is to support the research and writing of policy-relevant dissertations through funding of fieldwork, archival research and language training.

American Nephrology Nurses Association Education Scholarships and Grants

Support for members in their pursuit of higher education as well as grants for clinical research projects and patient or staff education programs.

Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship in Women’s Studies

The Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship in Women’s Studies encourages original and significant research about women that crosses disciplinary, regional, or cultural boundaries. Previous Fellows have explored such topics as transnational religious education for Muslim women, the complex gender dynamics of trans identity management, women’s electoral success across racial/institutional contexts, women’s sports, militarism and the education of American women, and the relationship between family commitments and women’s work mobility.

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations

W. Stull Holt Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of travel necessary to conduct research on a significant dissertation project dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Lawrence Gelfand – Armin Rappaport – Walter LeFeber Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of dissertation research travel for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Bemis grants.

Samuel Flagg Bemis Dissertation Research Grant

Fellowship to help defray the costs of domestic or international travel necessary to conduct research on significant scholarly projects for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber grants.

Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Innovation Fellowship

ACLS invites applications for Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Innovation Fellowships, which provide a year of support for doctoral students preparing to embark on innovative dissertation research projects.

Luce/ACLS Dissertation Fellowships in American Art History

ACLS invites applications for the Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Dissertation Fellowships in American Art designated for graduate students in any stage of PhD dissertation research or writing. Ten fellowships are available for a non-renewable, one-year term.

Hertz Foundation Graduate Fellowship Award

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for first year graduate students willing to make skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency.

Global Religion Doctoral Dissertation Fellowships

Fellowships are intended to promote among promising, young North American scholars the social scientific study of contemporary religions around the globe, especially in the “global south,” beyond the North Atlantic world (i.e., not the U.S., Canada, and Western Europe). They also intend to help better integrate the study of religion into mainstream social issues.

Christine Mirzayan Science and Technology Policy Graduate Fellowship Program

Spend 12 weeks in winter/spring at the National Academies in Washington, DC, learning about science and technology policy and the role that scientists and engineers play in advising the nation. Applicants become part of a National Academies committee, board, or unit where they are assigned to a mentor and learn about the world of science and technology policy.

Harry S. Truman Library Research Grant

Research Grants of up to \$2,500 are awarded twice annually to offset the cost of conducting research at the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum.

St John’s College Research Fellowships

Research fellowships intended for outstanding researchers early in their careers (including graduate students) to carry out independent research in a stimulating and supportive academic environment.

Students may use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or to purchase non-standard laboratory equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

November (Doctoral)

Lewis and Clark Fund for Exploration and Field Research
Exploratory field studies for the collection of specimens and data for doctoral students up to \$5,000.

The Robert H. N. Ho Family Foundation Dissertation Fellowships in Buddhist Studies
The Robert H. N. Ho Family Foundation Dissertation Fellowships in Buddhist Studies provide one-year stipends to PhD candidates for full time preparation of dissertations. The fellowship period may be used for fieldwork, archival research, analysis of findings, or for writing after research is complete.

Charlotte W. Newcombe Doctoral Dissertation Fellowship
Dissertation stage support for doctoral students whose work offers significant potential for advancing academic scholarship related to ethics and/or religion.

Amelia Earhart Fellowships from Zonta International Foundation
Established in 1938 in honor of Amelia Earhart, famed pilot and Zonta club member. The\$10,000 Fellowships are granted annually to women pursuing PhD degrees in aerospace-related sciences or aero-space-related engineering. Women of any nationality pursuing a Ph.D./doctoral degree, who demonstrate a superior academic record in the field of aerospace-related sciences or aerospace-related engineering, are eligible and encouraged to apply.

GEM PhD Science Fellowship
The goal of this program is to increase the number of minority students who pursue doctoral degrees in the natural science disciplines — chemistry, physics, earth sciences, mathematics, biological sciences, and computer science. Applicants to this program are accepted as early as their senior undergraduate year, as well as candidates currently enrolled in a Master’s of Engineering program and working professionals.

GEM PhD Engineering Program
Doctoral fellowships to underrepresented minority students who have either completed, are currently enrolled in a master’s in engineering program, or received admittance into a PhD program directly from a bachelor’s degree program.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants
Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research. The program contributes to the Foundation’s overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to provide significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity’s cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

American Medical Association Seed Grant Research Program
The program provides grants to support medical students, physician residents, and fellows in conducting small research projects.

Poetry Society of America Awards
Established by Maury Medwick in memory of his wife, the poet and editor, for an original poem in any form on a humanitarian theme.

WIIT Scholarship Program
Program is designed to provide financial assistance to further educational objectives of women who are interested in international development, international relations, international trade and economics, or international business.

National Art Education Foundation Grant
Grant opportunities for those working in art education.

American Association of University Women

American Association of University Women International Fellowship
Awarded for full-time study or research in the United States to women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

American Association of University Women Career Development Grants
Funding to women who hold a bachelor’s degree and are preparing to advance or change careers or reenter the workforce. Primary consideration is given to women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in nontraditional fields.

American Association of University Women American Dissertation Fellowship
The program provides fellowships for women pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conducting postdoctoral research full time, or preparing research for publication for eight consecutive weeks.

December (Doctoral)

ARCADIS Scholarship
\$5,000 scholarship to support a master’s or doctoral candidate seeking a degree in the water industry.

Dave Caldwell Scholarship
\$5,000 scholarship to benefit female and minority students pursuing an engineering degree in the drinking water field.

Woodard and Curran Scholarship
\$5,000 scholarship to support outstanding female and/or minority master’s students in pursuit of training in the field of water treatment.

American Water Scholarship

\$5,000 scholarship to support the development of professionals interested in service to the water industry.

American Water Works Association Academic Achievement Award

Recognizes contributions to the field of public water supply. All master's theses and doctoral dissertations relevant to the water supply industry.

DAAD Language Course Grant

This scholarship program aims to help students and graduates improve their knowledge of the German language (general language, special language) and cultural knowledge of the country. DAAD offers grants to applicants from North American universities, who at the time of application have attained at least sophomore standing (second-year standing in Canada), to attend 8-week intensive language courses at leading institutes in Germany.

RAND Graduate Student Summer Associate Program

Program designed to introduce students to RAND, an institution that conducts research on a wide range of national security problems and domestic and international social policy issues. Designed for full-time students who have completed at least two years of graduate work leading to a doctorate or professional degree (e.g., law, medicine, engineering).

NIH Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award (F31)

The purpose of the Kirschstein-NRSA predoctoral fellowship (F31) award is to enable promising predoctoral students to obtain individualized, mentored research training from outstanding faculty sponsors while conducting dissertation research in scientific health-related fields relevant to the missions of the participating NIH Institutes and Centers. The proposed mentored research training must reflect the applicant's dissertation research project and is expected to clearly enhance the individual's potential to develop into a productive, independent research scientist.

American Chemical Society Division of Analytical Chemistry Graduate Fellowship Program

Both nine-month (\$21,000) and summer (\$7,000) fellowships for PhD students researching analytical chemistry.

Association for Education Finance Policy Jean Flanigan Outstanding Dissertation Award

Award in recognition of exemplary dissertation research in the area of education finance and policy.

SMART Fellowship through the Department of Defense (DOD)

Supports undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics disciplines. The program aims to increase the number of civilian scientists and engineers working at DOD laboratories.

Society for the Study of Amphibians and Reptiles Grants in Herpetology

This program is intended to provide financial support for deserving individuals (with a primary emphasis on student researchers) or organizations involved in herpetological research, education, or conservation.

Higher Education Research Experience (HERE) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory HERE program provides opportunities for current graduate students to participate in research and related technical activities under the mentorship of world-class scientists. Graduate students in all STEM fields may apply for full-time or part-time experiences of flexible duration. Participants receive a bi-weekly stipend and a housing allowance. Program requirements may include attending enrichment

and professional development activities as well as the development and presentation of a deliverable such as a written research report, research poster, or formal presentation.

Advanced Short-Term Research Opportunity (ASTRO) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory's highly selective ASTRO program offers challenging short-term research opportunities to students enrolled in Master's or Doctoral programs or to those holding a Master's degree in any of the STEM disciplines. Participants conduct research in one of the laboratory's current programs with a senior mentor for 3 to 12 months and receive a monthly stipend. Participants may also attend professional development events and request funding for relocation, conference travel, and publication fees.

Computational Science & Technology Advanced Research Studies (C-STARS) Program

This paid research opportunity is open to all current graduate students with at least a 3.5 GPA who have received a Master's degree within the past five years. Participants spend usually 12 months at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) in Oak Ridge, Tennessee conducting computational research in areas that support ORNL missions. As of Spring/Summer, there are current openings in software engineering, geographic information systems, and life and medical sciences database research. Participants have access to state-of-the-art laboratory equipment, professional development activities, presentation opportunities, and a large professional network.

Nuclear Engineering Science Laboratory Synthesis (NESLS) Program

The Oak Ridge National Laboratory NESLS Program provides current undergraduates and graduates with the opportunity to conduct research and participate in associated activities related to nuclear engineering. Participants receive in-depth training and have flexible appointments in Spring, Summer, or Fall. Participants have a minimum 10-week stay either full-time or part-time and receive a weekly stipend, housing allowance, and other benefits.

Gerald R. Ford Presidential Foundation Research Travel Grants

Grants up to \$2,200 in support of research in the holdings of the Gerald R. Ford Library. The grant may be used to defray travel costs and living expenses.

German Chancellor Fellowship for Prospective Leaders

Grants support graduate students wishing to undertake independent projects at a German institution for one year, network with other prospective leaders from abroad, and explore solutions to the global issues of our times.

Gerald R. Ford Presidential Foundation Research Travel Grants

Grants up to \$2,200 in support of research in the holdings of the Gerald R. Ford Library. The grant may be used to defray travel costs and living expenses.

Harry S. Truman Library Research Grant

Research Grants of up to \$2,500 are awarded twice annually to offset the cost of conducting research at the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum.

St John's College Research Fellowships

Research fellowships intended for outstanding researchers early in their careers (including graduate students) to carry out independent research in a stimulating and supportive academic environment.

Fulbright Study/Research Grants and English Teaching Assistantships

The Fulbright Program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State and is the largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students to undertake graduate study and advanced research worldwide or to teach English abroad.

Center for Jewish History Seminar on Archival and Historical Research

The seminar's focus is on learning a variety of tools for accessing information and incorporating archival and library research into specific projects. In addition, participants will be introduced to the vast holdings of the Center's partner organizations, and the ways those collections are created, stored, and preserved. Open to master's students and PhD candidates in their first two years of matriculation.

American Councils for International Education

American Councils Title VIII Research Scholar Program

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake three to nine consecutive months of independent research in one of numerous countries within Eurasia or Eastern Europe, including Russia. Award amounts typically range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. The program's interests lie in research important to U.S. policy makers.

American Councils Title VIII Research & Language Training Program (CRLT)

Through this program, the U.S. Department of State funds graduate students in the humanities and social sciences to undertake research and language study for three to nine months in a number of countries in Eurasia and Eastern Europe, including Russia. Typical awards range from \$7,000 to \$25,000. Project proposals should deal with issues relevant to U.S. policy makers.

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations

W. Stull Holt Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of travel necessary to conduct research on a significant dissertation project dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Lawrence Gelfand – Armin Rappaport – Walter LeFeber Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of dissertation research travel for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Bemis grants.

Samuel Flagg Bemis Dissertation Research Grant

Fellowship to help defray the costs of domestic or international travel necessary to conduct research on significant scholarly projects for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber grants.

Smithsonian Institution—STRI Short-Term Fellowship Program

Provides support for graduate students and introduces them to tropical research. These fellowships enable selected candidates to work in and explore research possibilities at STRI.

Naval Research Enterprise Internship Program

Summer internships for students to participate in research at a Department of Navy laboratory.

Wolf Trap Internships

Spring, Summer, and Fall internships available to foster the next generation of arts leaders. 12-week program with flexible start and end dates in Washington, DC.

Dumbarton Oaks Research Library and Collection

Summer Fellowship

Fellowships for Byzantine, Pre-Columbian, or Garden and Landscape scholars on any level of advancement beyond the first year of graduate (post-baccalaureate) study.

Junior Fellowship

Fellowships for students who have fulfilled all preliminary requirements for the PhD and will be working on a dissertation at Dumbarton Oaks under the direction of a faculty member at their own university.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research. Leifur Eiríksson Foundation Scholarship Program

For graduate research or study at universities in Iceland. Up to \$25,000 in project costs, including travel to and from the research or study site will be paid on the scholar’s behalf.

National Museum of the American Indian Internship Program

Internships are provided for students interested in the museum profession and related fields.

Kress History of Art: Institutional Fellowship

Advanced training in European art history requires direct exposure to the object of study, prolonged access to key information resources such as libraries and photographic archives, the development of professional relationships with colleagues abroad, and sustained immersion in European cultures.

Carnegie Saharan Crossroads Fellowship Program

Saharan Crossroads seeks to counter the conceptual divide separating North and sub-Saharan Africa and the tendency to view the Sahara Desert as an impenetrable barrier dividing the continent into the northern “white” and sub-Saharan “black” Africa.
