Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation US Artists International Grants

September 7, 2018; November 30, 2018; April 3, 2019 (depending on timeline)

Funding for American artists to perform at important cultural festivals and art marketplaces around the globe.

Christine Mirzayan Science and Technology Policy Graduate Fellowship Program

September 7, 2018

Spend 12 weeks in winter/spring at the National Academies in Washington, DC, learning about science and technology policy and how scientists and engineers advise the nation. Applicants join a National Academies committee, board, or unit where they learn under a mentor about the world of science and technology policy.

Gerald R. Ford Presidential Foundation Research Travel Grants

September 15, 2018; March 15, 2019

Grants up to \$2,200 supporting research in the holdings of the Gerald R. Ford Library.

German Chancellor Fellowship for Prospective Leaders

September 15, 2018

Conduct independent projects at a host institution in Germany for one year, network with other prospective leaders from abroad and explore new solutions to the global issues of our times

Women Chemists Committee/Eli Lilly Travel Awards

September 15, 2018; March 1, 2019

Need-based grants offered to graduate and postdoctoral women chemists to travel and present the results of their research at scientific meetings.

Harry S. Truman Library Research Grant

October 1, 2018; April 1, 2019

Research Grants of up to \$2,500 are awarded twice annually to offset the cost of conducting research at the Harry S. Truman Library and Museum.

St John's College Research Fellowships

October 1, 2018

Research fellowships intended for outstanding researchers early in their careers (including graduate students) to carry out independent research in a stimulating and supportive academic environment.

Fulbright Study/Research Grants and English Teaching Assistantships

October 9, 2018 (National Deadline); August 30, 2018 (Internal Deadline)

The Fulbright Program, sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, is the largest U.S. international exchange program offering opportunities for students to undertake study and research, or teach English, worldwide.

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations

October 15, 2018

W. Stull Holt Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship to help defray cost of travel necessary to conduct research on a significant dissertation project dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Lawrence Gelfand – Armin Rappaport – Walter LeFeber Dissertation Fellowship

Fellowship intended to defray the costs of dissertation research travel for students actively working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Bemis grants.

Samuel Flagg Bemis Dissertation Research Grant

Fellowship to help defray cost of domestic or international travel necessary for research on significant dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Stuart L. Bernath, Holt, and Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber grants.

Smithsonian Institution—STRI Short-Term Fellowship Program

October 15, 2018; February 15, 2019; April 15, 2019; July 15, 2019

Support for graduate students and introduces them to tropical research. These fellowships enable selected candidates to work in the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute and explore research possibilities at STRI.

Naval Research Enterprise Internship Program

October 31, 2018

Summer internships for students to participate in research at a Department of Navy laboratory.

Albert M. Greenfield Foundation Dissertation Fellowship

November 1, 2018

Supports dissertation research in residence at the Library Company on any subject relevant to its collections.

Wolf Trap Internships

November 1, 2018; February 1, 2019; March 1, 2019; July 1, 2019 (depending on program)

Spring, Summer, and Fall internships available to foster the next generation of arts leaders. 12-week program with flexible start and end dates in Washington, DC.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

November 1, 2018; May 1, 2019

Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research. The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to provide significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

Dumbarton Oaks Research Library and Collection

November 1, 2018

Summer Fellowship

Fellowships for Byzantine, Pre-Columbian, or Garden and Landscape scholars on any level of advancement beyond the first year of graduate (post-baccalaureate) study.

Short-Term Predoctoral Residencies

Dumbarton Oaks offers a limited number of Short-Term Predoctoral Residencies to advanced graduate students studying for comprehensive exams, dissertating, or expecting their final degree in certain fields.

Junior Fellowship

Fellowships for students done with preliminary requirements for the PhD or final degree working on a dissertation/final project at Dumbarton Oaks under the direction of an advisor at their own university

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

German Studies Research Grant

November 1, 2018; May 1, 2019

Specialized program offers research grants to highly-qualified undergraduate and graduate students nominated by their department/program chairs. May be used for short-term research in Germany.

DAAD Long Term Research Grants (One-Year Grants)

November 5, 2018

Long-term research grants are awarded to highly qualified candidates who desire to conduct long-term research (7-10 months) or join a German doctoral program.

Henry Luce/ACLS Program in China Studies Predissertation-Summer Travel Grants

November 7, 2018

Predissertation-summer travel grants, and collaborative reading-workshop grants available.

Critical Language Scholarship Program

November 15, 2018 (anticipated)

Part of a U.S. government effort to expand dramatically the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages. Languages Supported: Azerbaijani, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Indonesian, Korean, Punjabi, Swahili, Turkish, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Chinese, Japanese, and Russian.

Roosevelt Institute Research Grant

November 15, 2018

Funds are awarded for the sole purpose of helping to defray living, travel, and related expenses incurred while conducting research at the Roosevelt Library. The grants program is particularly designed to encourage younger scholars to expand our knowledge and understanding of the Roosevelt period.

Leifur Eiríksson Foundation Scholarship Program

November 16, 2018

For graduate research or study at universities in Iceland. Up to \$25,000 in project costs, including travel to and from the research or study site will be paid on the scholar's behalf.

National Museum of the American Indian Internship Program

November 20, 2018; February 6, 2019; July 12, 2019

Internships are provided for students interested in the museum profession and related fields. Locations are in Maryland, Washington D.C. or New York for a duration of 10 weeks.

Kress History of Art: Institutional Fellowship

November 30, 2018

Advanced training in European art history requires direct exposure to the object of study, prolonged access to key information resources such as libraries and photographic archives, the development of professional relationships with colleagues abroad, and sustained immersion in European cultures. These related needs are often best satisfied by extended engagement with a European art research center. The Kress History of Art: Institutional Fellowships are intended to provide promising young art historians with the opportunity to experience just this kind of immersion.

John Carter Brown Library Research Fellowships

December 1, 2018

Supports research for two to four months at the John Carter Brown Library on the colonial history of the Americas (North and South), including all aspects of the European, African, and Native American involvement.

Neotropical Grassland Conservancy (NGC) Student Grant Program

December 1, 2018; April 1, 2019; August 1, 2019

The foundation's mission is promoting the conservation of savannas, gallery forests, wetlands, and associated ecosystems in Central and South America. The Student Grant Program (SGP) was designed in response to feedback from Venezuelan professors. Graduate student research projects are often hindered by lack of funds for basic needs such as transportation, lodging, meals and consumable field supplies. Open to Latin American students enrolled in a M.S. or Ph.D. program in a US or South American university.

RAND Graduate Student Summer Associate Program

December 1, 2018 (anticipated)

Program designed to introduce students to RAND, an institution that conducts research on a wide range of national security problems and domestic and international social policy. For full-time students having completed at least two years of graduate work toward a doctorate/professional degree (law, medicine, engineering).

Women Techmakers Scholars Program

December 11, 2018 (anticipated)

Awards for female graduate students in computer science, computer engineering, or closely related technical field. Includes support for the academic year and participation in the Annual Google Scholars' Retreat.

Qasid Annual Scholarship Program

December 15, 2018 (anticipated)

Scholarship to study Arabic at the Qasid Arabic Institute. Either one quarter (Summer or Fall) or five quarters.

KRESS Fellowships for Language Study

December 15, 2018

Fellowships for art history and art conservation graduate students to attend the Middlebury Summer Language Schools in French, German, Italian, Portuguese, Russian, or Spanish.

Scientific and Technological Research Council of Turkey

Deadline: See website for openings

Fellowships for international PhD students to pursue their research in Turkey. The program aims to promote Turkey's scientific and technological collaboration with countries of the prospective researchers.

Institute for Humane Studies Conference and Research Grant

Deadline: Rolling, at least four weeks before activity for which you are seeking funding

Grants awarded to graduate students advancing the principles of freedom through their career to present at academic or professional conferences, travel to academic job interviews on a campus or at a conference, travel to archives or libraries for research, and participate in career-development seminars.

The Department of Energy (DOE) CBFO Program provides the opportunity to conduct mission-oriented research in DOE's CBFO in Carlsbad, New Mexico, or at other sites throughout the DOE complex.

International Ocean Discovery Program Expedition

The International Ocean Discovery Program (IODP) is an international research collaboration that coordinates seagoing expeditions to study the history of the Earth recorded in sediments and rocks beneath the ocean floor. The JOIDES Resolution Science Operator (JRSO) operates the scientific drillship JOIDES Resolution on behalf of the National Science Foundation.

Lindau Nobel Laureate Meeting

Once every year, about 30 Nobel Laureates convene at Lindau to meet the next generation of leading scientists: 400-500 undergraduates, PhD students, and post-doc researchers from all over the world. The Lindau Nobel Laureate Meetings foster the exchange among scientists of different generations, cultures, and disciplines.

KOSMOS Summer University Fellowship

September 1, 2018

Grants for research related to literacy and writing in and out of formal education. The organization is also interested in research that can be addressed to scholars and the public.

Craft Research Fund Graduate Research Grant

September 28, 2018

Grants to support research for a master's thesis related to U.S. studio craft.

AHIMA Foundation

September 30, 2018

Merit Scholarships

\$2,000 award for students pursuing a Master's degree in areas related to Health Information Management (HIM) or Health Informatics Technology (HIT). One of the major initiatives of the AHIMA Foundation is to attract and support new talent in the HIM industry by improving educational opportunities for current and future HIM professionals through scholarships.

Veterans Scholarships

Scholarships for veterans and their spouses in Health Informatics and Information Management programs.

American Water Works Association Academic Achievement Award

October 1, 2018

Recognizes contributions to the field of public water supply. All master's theses and doctoral dissertations relevant to the water supply industry.

Archives of American Art Fellowships and Internships

October 1, 2018; February 25, 2019; June 1, 2019

Multiple internships of at least 10 weeks for students interested in archival science, information management, museum studies, art, administration, art history, and cultural studies.

National Academy of Sciences Sigma Xi Grants-in-Aid of Research

October 1, 2018; March 15, 2019

The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from the National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision related research. Students use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or for purchase of non-standard laboratory equipment necessary for a specific research project.

Women Divers Hall of Fame Scholarship

October 1, 2018

The Women Divers Hall of Fame (WDHOF) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to honoring and raising awareness of the contributions of outstanding women divers. WDHOF provides educational, mentorship, financial, and career opportunities to the diving community throughout the world. Each year, WDHOF awards scholarships and training grants that provide financial and educational support to individuals of all ages, particularly those who are preparing for professional careers that involve diving.

Phi Kappa Phi Love of Learning Research Grant

October 1, 2018; April 1, 2019

Love of Learning Awards help fund post-baccalaureate professional development for active Phi Kappa Phi members to include (but not be limited to): Graduate or professional studies, doctoral dissertations, continuing education, career development, travel related to teaching/research/learning, etc.

National Art Education Foundation Grant

October 1, 2018 (anticipated)

Grant opportunities for those working in art education.

SHRM Foundation Graduate Student Scholarship

October 1, 2018

SHRM will award twenty-two \$5000 scholarships for graduate students in programs with an emphasis area in HR or an HR-related program (such as business, psychology or labor relations).

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations Myrna F. Bernath Fellowship

October 15, 2018

Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

October 15, 2018 (anticipated)

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

Justin G. Schiller Prize for Bibliographical Work on Pre-20th Century Children's Books

October 15, 2018

An award of the Bibliographical Society of America for work in historical children's books. Works nominated, which must be in English, may concentrate on any children's book printed before 1901 in any country.

Rockefeller Archives Center Research Stipend Program

October 15, 2018

The Rockefeller Archive Center's competitive programs are designed to provide assistance to scholars who need to visit the Rockefeller Archive Center in Sleepy Hollow, NY to conduct research in its collections.

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Grants

October 15, 2018; July 15, 2019

Scholarships and grants for graduate students studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields. Must demonstrate potential to advance the principles of the free and virtuous society, including recognition of human dignity, the importance of the rule of law, limited government, religious liberty, and freedom in economic life.

Ludo Frevel Crystallography Scholarships

October 17, 2018

Scholarships for graduate students enrolled in graduate degree programs with major interest in crystallography.

National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship Program (NSF - GRFP)

October 22-26, 2018 (discipline-dependent)

Provides three years of support for the graduate education of individuals who have demonstrated their potential for significant achievements in science and engineering research. Students must be in their first or second year of a research based Masters or PhD program and cannot have previously earned a Master's degree. Deadlines vary depending on area of study; see website for exact dates.

Hertz Foundation

October 24, 2018

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for first year graduate students willing to make skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency.

American Society of Testing and Materials Project Grant

October 31, 2018

ASTM International offers a limited number of \$500 grants to university students to help with student design projects that contain an ASTM International standards component.

ACI Foundation Fellowships and Scholarships

November 1, 2018

Fellowships and scholarships are available for eligible graduate students whose studies relate to concrete.

American Cancer Society Graduate Scholarships in Cancer Nursing

November 1, 2018

Supports graduate students pursuing a master's degree in cancer nursing or doctorate of nursing practice (DNP). Awards may be for two years, with stipend of \$10,000 per year.

Roy Scrivner Memorial Research Grant

November 1, 2018

This \$11,000 grant is for funding empirical and applied research focused on lesbian, gay, and bisexual family psychology and lesbian, gay and bisexual family therapy.

Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans

November 1, 2018

Every year, The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans supports thirty New Americans, immigrants or the children of immigrants, who are pursuing graduate school in the United States. Selection criteria emphasize creativity, originality, initiative, and sustained accomplishment. The program values a commitment to the Constitution and the Bill of Rights. The program does not have any quotas for types of degrees, universities or programs, countries of origin, or gender, etc.

Department of Transportation Outstanding Student of the Year Award

November 3, 2018 (anticipated)

Each year at the annual winter meeting of the Transportation Research Board, the Department honors the most outstanding student from each participating University Transportation Center (UTC) for his/her achievements and promise for future contributions to the transportation field. Students of the year are selected based on their accomplishments in technical merit and research, academic performance, professionalism, and leadership.

Tallahassee Mayoral Fellowship Program

November 6, 2018 (anticipated)

Yearlong fellowship for graduate students to engage with key areas of City government and serve in invaluable front-line positions alongside top leaders of City Hall.

GEM MS Engineering Fellowship Program

November 13, 2018

The objective of this program is to promote the benefits of a master's degree within industry. GEM Fellows are provided practical engineering summer work experiences through an employer sponsor and a portable academic year fellowship of tuition, fees, and a stipend which may be used at any participating GEM Member University where the GEM Fellow is admitted.

WTS International Diane Woodend Jones Leadership Legacy Scholarship

November 14, 2018 (anticipated)

Scholarship for an outstanding young woman pursuing graduate studies working toward a career in transportation or a related field, and who demonstrates a specific interest in advancing transportation innovation in the international arena.*Contact OGFA if interested in applying*

American Association of University Women International Fellowship

November 15, 2018 (see website for other awards)

Awarded for full-time study or research in the United States to women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Both graduate and postgraduate studies at accredited U.S. institutions are supported.

November 15, 2018

Designed to increase the number of U.S. citizens and nationals trained in science and engineering disciplines of military importance. The DoD will offer these fellowships to individuals who have demonstrated the ability and special aptitude for advanced training in science and engineering.

P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education

Deadline: 3-4 months prior to the start of the term for which the grant is requested

One-time need based grants to women who are citizens or legal permanent residents of the U.S. or Canada for use in completing a degree or certification necessary for improving or gaining skills leading to employment.

Segal AmeriCorps Education Award

Deadlines vary

The AmeriCorps Education Award is a post-service benefit received by individuals who complete terms of national service in approved AmeriCorps programs, such as AmeriCorps VISTA, AmeriCorps NCCC, or AmeriCorps State and National.

Richard A. Horovitz Fund for Professional Development

National Academy of Sciences Sigma Xi Grants-in-Aid of Research

October 1, 2018; March 15, 2019

The program awards grants of up to \$1,000 to students from all areas of the sciences and engineering. Designated funds from the National Academy of Sciences allow for grants of up to \$5,000 for astronomy research and \$2,500 for vision related research. Students use the funding to pay for travel expenses to and from a research site, or for purchasing non-standard lab equipment necessary to complete a specific research project.

Phi Kappa Phi Love of Learning Research Grant

October 1, 2018

Love of Learning Awards help fund post-baccalaureate professional development for active Phi Kappa Phi members to include (but not be limited to): Graduate or professional studies, doctoral dissertations, continuing education, career development, travel related to teaching/research/learning, etc.

National Art Education Foundation Grant

October 1, 2018 (anticipated)

Grant opportunities for those working in art education.

Doctoral (Continued)

K. Patricia Cross Future Leaders Award

October 3, 2018 (anticipated)

Recognizes doctoral students who show exemplary promise as future leaders of higher education, who demonstrate a commitment to developing academic and civic responsibility in themselves and others, and whose work reflects a strong emphasis on teaching and learning. Student must be nominated by a faculty member or administrator.

National Academy of Education/Spencer Dissertation Fellowship

October 4, 2018

The Dissertation Fellowship Program seeks to encourage a new generation of scholars from a wide range of disciplines and professional fields to undertake research relevant to the improvement of education. These \$27,500 fellowships support individuals whose dissertations show potential for bringing fresh and constructive perspectives to the history, theory, analysis, or practice of formal or informal education anywhere in the world.

Smith Richardson Foundation (SRF) World Politics and Statecraft Fellowship

October 8, 2018

Grants to support PhD dissertation research on American foreign policy, international relations, international security, strategic studies, area studies and diplomatic and military history. The fellowship supports the research and writing of policy-relevant dissertations by funding fieldwork, archival research and language training.

SHRM Foundation Graduate Student Scholarships

October 1, 2018

Scholarships graduate students in programs with an emphasis area in HR or an HR-related program (such as business, psychology or labor relations).

Society for Historians of American Foreign Relations

October 15, 2018

W. Stull Holt Dissertation Fellowship

Stuart L Bernath Dissertation Research Grant

Grant intended to help defray the expenses encountered in the writing of the dissertation by students working on dissertations dealing with some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history. Applicants for this award will be considered automatically for the Holt, Gelfand-Rappaport-LaFeber, and Bemis grants.

Myrna F. Bernath Fellowship

Fellowship intended to promote scholarship in U.S. foreign relations history by women. Awarded every two years (in odd years).

Michael J. Hogan Foreign Language Fellowship

Fellowship to promote research in foreign language resources by graduate students researching some aspect of U.S. foreign relations history.

Justin G. Schiller Prize for Bibliographical Work on Pre-20th Century Children's Books

October 15, 2018

Encourages scholarship in the bibliography of historical children's books. Works put into nomination, which must be in English, may concentrate on any children's book printed before the year 1901 in any country.

American Cancer Society Doctoral Degree Scholarships in Cancer Nursing

October 15, 2018

Supports graduate students pursuing a master's degree in cancer nursing or doctorate of nursing practice (DNP). Awards may be for two years, with stipend of \$15,000 per year.

American Nephrology Nurses Association Education Scholarships and Grants

October 15, 2018

Supports members pursuing higher education and grants for clinical research and patient/staff education.

Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Calihan Academic Grants

October 15, 2018

Scholarships and grants for graduate students currently studying theology, philosophy, economics, or related fields must demonstrate the potential to advance understanding in the relationship between theology and the principles of the free and virtuous society. Such principles include recognition of human dignity, the importance of the rule of law, limited government, religious liberty, and freedom in economic life.

Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship in Women's Studies

October 15, 2018

The Woodrow Wilson Dissertation Fellowship in Women's Studies encourages original and significant research about women across disciplinary, regional, or cultural boundaries. Previous Fellows have explored transnational religious education for Muslim women, the complex gender dynamics of trans identity management, women's electoral success across racial and institutional contexts, women's sports, militarism and the education of American women, and the relationship between family commitments and women's work mobility.

Global Religion Doctoral Dissertation Fellowships

October 15, 2018

Up to eight fellowships per are to be awarded with the goal of promoting among promising, young North American scholars the social scientific study of contemporary religions around the globe, especially in the "global south," beyond the North Atlantic world (i.e., not the U.S., Canada, and Western Europe). They also intend to help better integrate the study of religion into mainstream social issues. Each fellowship is worth \$28,000.

October 24, 2018

Cost-of-education allowance and a stipend for first year graduate students willing to make skills available to U.S. in time of national emergency.

American Council of Learned Societies

October 24, 2018

Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Completion Fellowships

ACLS invites applications for the tenth annual competition for the Mellon/ACLS Dissertation Completion Fellowships, which support a year of research and writing to help advanced graduate students in the humanities and related social sciences in the last year of PhD dissertation writing. The program encourages timely completion of the PhD.

Luce/ACLS Dissertation Fellowships in American Art History

ACLS invites applications for the Henry Luce Foundation/ACLS Dissertation Fellowships in American Art designated for graduate students in any stage of PhD dissertation research or writing. Ten fellowships are available for a non-renewable, one-year term.

Dumbarton Oaks Junior Fellowship

November 1, 2018

Fellowships for students who have fulfilled all preliminary requirements for the PhD or appropriate final degree and will be working on a dissertation or final project at Dumbarton Oaks under the direction of a faculty member at their own university.

The Wenner-Gren Foundation Dissertation Fieldwork Grants

November 1, 2018; May 1, 2019

Awarded to aid doctoral or thesis research. The program contributes to the Foundation's overall mission to support basic research in anthropology and to ensure that the discipline continues to provide significant work that furthers our understanding of humanity's cultural and biological origins, development, and variation.

Fahs-Beck Doctoral Dissertation Grant Program

November 1, 2018; April 1, 2019

American Association of University Women American Dissertation Fellowship

November 1, 2018

Fellowships for women pursuing full-time study to complete dissertations, conduct postdoctoral research, or prepare research for publication for eight consecutive weeks. Candidates are expected to demonstrate active commitment to helping women and girls through service in their communities, professions, or fields of research.

Program in China Studies Predissertation Summer Travel Grants

November 7, 2018

Predissertation—summer travel grants, postdoctoral fellowships as well as collaborative reading-workshop grants available.

Robert N. H. No Family Foundation Dissertation Fellowships in Buddhist Studies

November 14, 2018

The Robert H. N. Ho Family Foundation Dissertation Fellowships in Buddhist Studies provide one-year stipends to PhD candidates for full time preparation of dissertations. The fellowship period may be used for fieldwork, archival research, analysis of findings, or for writing after research is complete.

WTS International Diane Woodend Jones Leadership Legacy Scholarship

November 9, 2018 (anticipated)

Scholarship for an outstanding young woman pursuing graduate studies working toward a career in transportation or a related field and demonstrating specific interest in transportation innovation in the international arena.

Charlotte W. Newcombe Doctoral Dissertation Fellowship

November 15, 2018

Dissertation stage support for doctoral students whose work offers significant potential for advancing academic scholarship related to ethics and/or religion.

Amelia Earhart Fellowships from Zonta International Foundation

November 15, 2018

Established in 1938 in honor of Amelia Earhart, famed pilot and Zonta club member. The \$10,000 Fellowships are granted annually to women pursuing PhD degrees in aerospace-related sciences or aero-space-related engineering. Women of any nationality pursuing a Ph.D./doctoral degree, who demonstrate a superior academic record in the field of aerospace-related sciences or aerospace-related engineering, are encouraged to apply.

National GEM Consortium

November 13, 2018

GEM PhD Engineering Program

The objective of this program is to offer doctoral fellowships to underrepresented minority students who have either completed, are currently enrolled in a master's in engineering program, or received admittance into a PhD program directly from a bachelor's degree program. Fellowships may be used at any participating GEM Member University where the GEM Fellow is admitted.

GEM PhD Science Fellowship

The goal of this program is to increase the number of minority students who pursue doctoral degrees in the natural science disciplines — chemistry, physics, earth sciences, mathematics, biological sciences, and computer science. Applicants to this program are accepted as early as their senior undergraduate year, as well as candidates currently enrolled in a Master's of Engineering program and working professionals.

American Association of University Women

November 15, 2018

American Association of University Women International Fellowship

Awarded for full-time study or research in the United States to women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Both graduate and postgraduate studies at accredited U.S. institutions are supported.

American Association of University Women Career Development Grants

Funding to women holding a bachelor's degree preparing to advance /change careers or reenter the workforce. Primary consideration is given to women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in nontraditional fields.

Roosevelt Institute Research Grant

November 15, 2018

Funds are awarded for the sole purpose of helping to defray living, travel, and related expenses incurred while conducting research at the Roosevelt Library. The grants program is particularly designed to encourage younger scholars to expand our knowledge and understanding of the Roosevelt period.

P.E.O. Scholar Award

November 20, 2018

P.E.O. Scholar Awards are one-time, competitive, merit-based awards for women of the United States and Canada who are pursuing a doctoral level degree at an accredited college or university in the United States or Canada. In addition to recognizing and encouraging excellence in higher education, these awards provide partial support for study and research for women who will make significant contributions in their varied fields of endeavor. Priority is given to women who are well established in their programs, study or research.

Doctoral (Continued)

National Institute of Justice Graduate Research Fellowship Program

November 21, 2018 (anticipated)

Supports doctoral students engaged in research that advances NIJ's mission and works to increase the pool of scholars engaged in research that addresses the challenges of crime and justice in the United States, particularly at the state and local levels. The program has two tracks: Social & Behavioral Sciences and STEM.

Knowles Science Teaching Foundation Fellowship

November 26, 2018 (anticipated)

Teaching fellowships for those committed to teaching math or science in grades 9-12 as their primary career.

National Physical Science Consortium Graduate Fellowships in Science, Engineering and Math

November 30, 2018 (anticipated)

Fellowships for graduate students in Astronomy, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geology, Materials Science, Mathematical Sciences, Physics, and related Engineering fields. Initial support may be for 2 to 3 years, or a full 6 years, depending on the employer-sponsor.

Kress History of Art: Institutional Fellowship

November 30, 2018

Advanced training in European art history requires direct exposure to the object of study, prolonged access to key information resources such as libraries and photographic archives, the development of professional relationships with colleagues abroad, and sustained immersion in European cultures. These related needs are often best satisfied by extended engagement with a European art research center. These fellowships are intended to provide promising young art historians with the opportunity to experience just this kind of immersion.

Neotropical Grassland Conservancy (NGC) Student Grant Program

December 1, 2018; April 1, 2019; August 1, 2019

The foundation's mission is promoting the conservation of savannas, gallery forests, wetlands, and associated ecosystems in Central and South America. The Student Grant Program (SGP) was designed in response to feedback from Venezuelan professors. Graduate student research projects are often hindered by lack of funds for basic needs such as transportation, lodging, meals and consumable field supplies. Open to Latin American students enrolled in a M.S. or Ph.D. program in a US or South American university.

UNCF-Merck Graduate Science Research Dissertation Fellowships

December 1, 2018 (anticipated)

Funds full-time, African American PhD students in STEM fields 1-3 years from completing dissertation research.

Doris Duke Fellowship for the Promotion of Child Well-Being

December 1, 2018

The Fellowships are designed to identify and develop a new generation of leaders interested in and capable of creating practice and policy initiatives that will enhance child development and improve the nation's ability to prevent all forms of child maltreatment.

U.S. Department of Defense

SMART Fellowship through the Department of Defense (DoD)

December 1, 2018

Supports undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics disciplines. The program aims to increase the number of civilian scientists and engineers working at DoD laboratories.

National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate Fellowship

December 31, 2018 (anticipated)

Fellowship designed to increase the number of U.S. citizens & nationals trained in science & engineering disciplines of military importance. The DoD will offer these fellowships to individuals who have demonstrated the ability and special aptitude for advanced training in science and engineering.

D. Kim Foundation Dissertation Fellowship

December 1, 2018

One or two fellowships (up to \$25,000 each) will be awarded annually to Ph.D. candidates who are writing their dissertations. The Foundation provides fellowships and grants to support graduate students and young scholars who are working in the history of science and technology in modern East Asia, regardless of their nationality, origins, or gender. Ford Foundation Fellowship Program—Predoctoral and Dissertation Fellowships

December 6, 2018 (Dissertation); December 13, 2018 (Predoctoral)

Through its Fellowship Programs, the Ford Foundation seeks to increase the diversity of the nation's college and university faculties by increasing their ethnic and racial diversity, to maximize the educational benefits of diversity, and to increase the number of professors who can and will use diversity as a resource for enriching the education of all students.

Jennings Randolph Peace Scholarship Dissertation Program

December 8, 2018

Fellowships to advance research that contributes to a wider understanding of how to manage conflict and build sustainable peace effectively.

National Institutes of Health

NIH Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award (F31)

December 8, 2018 (anticipated)

December 15, 2018

Scholarship for members of proven academic excellence combined with a solid range of extracurricular activities.

P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship

December 15, 2018 (Deadline for Eligibility Form)

The International Peace Scholarship Fund, established in 1949, is a program which provides scholarships for selected women from other countries for graduate study in the United States and Canada. Members of P.E.O. believe that education is fundamental to world peace and understanding.

ACS Division of Analytical Chemistry Graduate Student Fellowship Program

December 15, 2018 (anticipated)

Both nine-month (\$21,000) and summer (\$7,000) fellowships for PhD students researching analytical chemistry.

American Musicological Society

December 17, 2018

Alvin H. Johnson AMS 50 Dissertation-year Fellowships

Dissertation-year support for doctoral students whose degree emphasizes musical scholarship. It is expected that a Fellow's dissertation will be completed within the fellowship year.

The Howard Mayer Brown Fellowship

For increasing presence of minority scholars/teachers of musicology. The fellowship supports one year of graduate work for an underrepresented student in musicology at a North American University.

American Medical Association Seed Grant Research Program

December 20, 2018 (anticipated)

The program provides grants to support medical students, physician residents, and fellows in conducting small research projects.

Wilson Center Internships with the Middle East Program

December 31, 2018

The Program concentrates on long-term developments and how such issues impact stability and growth in the region and its relations with the United States. Award in recognition of exemplary dissertation research in the area of education finance and policy.

Deadlines vary
