

Applying for a Grant Opportunity

- Does this require sign-off or certification by an Authorized Institutional Official?
 - Review the Funding Opportunity
 Announcement
 - Consult with your departmental representative
 - Consult with SRA staff

Solicitation (aka RFA, FOA)


There may not be one. If there is -

- Read it! The solicitation tells you:
 - Eligibility applying as an individual or is this an institutional submission?
 - Deadline
 - <u>Limited Submission</u> (Office of Proposal Development
 - Pre-proposal or letter of intent required
 - Funding or budget limits
 - How to apply
 - Formatting



- The solicitation may state:
 - "standard proposal preparation guidelines apply"
 - "All instructions in the SF424 (R&R) Application Guide must be followed"

Find that agency's Proposal Preparation Guide



Applying for a Grant Opportunity

- If it is determined that institutional review and signature is required, then determine which office will submit your proposal:
 - Sponsored Research Administration
 - · If any government funds "touch" the award
 - FSU Research Foundation
 - If it is all private or foreign dollars



- Sponsored Research Administration (SRA) handles opportunities that involve U.S. public funding
 - Federal agencies
 - State agencies
 - Local governments
 - Private organizations that are flowing down U.S. public funding (flowthrough)




- FSU Research
 Foundation (FSURF)
 handles private and foreign dollars
 - American Heart Association
 - A foreign university
 - No U.S. public dollars are involved at any stage



FSU's Proposal Submission Policy

University Policy 7A-19:

• In order to meet the 3-day rule,

COMPLETE PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS

must be submitted to SRA/FSURF 3 days
before the sponsor deadline, and all fields
and documents entered/uploaded into the
sponsor's website



- Solicitation
- 2. Budget
- 3. Budget Justification
- 4. Scope of Work
- 5. Proposal Transmittal Form (PTF)
- 6. Other forms as needed, both internal and sponsor-requested



- Budget = often an Excel document with formulas demonstrating how salary, fringe, travel, etc., were calculated. Used by SRA to review.
- Budget Justification = a 'budget map' in narrative form explaining how numbers were reached for each component of the budget. Can vary widely by agency so there is no particular desired format.

Allowable -- Does this follow FSU and sponsor policy?

Allocable-- Does this benefit the project?

Reasonable and Accurate -- Does this make sense and add up?


Compliant- Does this adhere to federal, state and FSU policies?



- Proposal Transmittal Form (PTF)
- Fill it out completely
- Signed by PI, Chair, Dean and other FSU individuals who are named in the proposal (for example, a mentor)

PTF needed

- If an "authorized official" must review, sign, or certify in any way
- If the preliminary proposal or letter contains budget information
- If the PI is submitting a subaward proposal to an entity

NO PTF

 If PI is submitting a 'white paper' or 'one pager' or 'letter of interest' with no budget or other certifications



- Human Subjects FSU's Institutional Review Board (IRB)
 - New guidance from NIH regarding clinical trials
- Animal Subjects Animal Care and Use Committee (ACUC)
- Nondisclosure agreements / Intellectual Property / Export control

Workspace for Grants.gov



Replaces PDF application packages. Used by many different agencies. Register, add FSU as a profile on your account, then contact grants officer to add "role." Start application, add FSU (KKEMPER06) as PARTICIPANT so that SRA can view and submit.

FastLane & Research.gov for NSF



Set up account at Research.gov. PI starts application and allows "SPO access" so SRA can view it.

- After receipt of all required proposal documents and internal forms, and Sponsored Research review and approval, it's time to submit!
- What does this mean to you?
 - SRA will submit electronic packages will require "green light" email from PI to submit
 - Hard copies can be picked up at SRA for department to mail or deliver
 - Emailed proposals PI choice, SRA must be copied

Some awards administered by SRA

- NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program – provides \$34,000 annual stipend (paid monthly) plus tuition/fees
- NSF Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement Grants (DDIG)
- NIH Ruth Kirschsteiner fellowship provides stipend (commensurate with Fellow's education level) plus tuition/fees





McKnight Doctoral Fellowships

Established in 1984, the FEF's McKnight Doctoral Fellowship Program has increased the number of African Americans who have earned Ph.D.'s in historically underrepresented, crucial disciplines where African Americans have not historically enrolled and completed degree programs. The FEF has awarded more than 750 Fellowships to African Americans and Hispanics pursuing Ph.D.'s, and the Program enjoys an impressive retention rate of over 84%. More than 500 Fellows have graduated with Ph.D.'s, in an average completion time of 5.5 years.

Up to 50 Fellowships (renewable for up to five years) are granted each year to students pursuing doctoral degrees at one of 9-participating-institutions in the State of Florida. Each Fellowship consists of \$17,000 per year in tuition, fees, and stipend.

PURPOSE:

The McKnight Doctoral Fellowship program is designed to address the under-representation of African American and Hispanic faculty at colleges and universities in the state of Florida by increasing the pool of citizens qualified with Ph.D. degrees to teach at the college and university levels. As a by-product, it is expected that employment opportunities in industry will also be expanded.

THE AWARD:

Up to 50 Fellowships are awarded annually to study at one of nine participating Florida universities. Each award provides annual tuition up to \$5,000 (tuition above this amount is waived by the participating institution) for each of three academic years plus an annual stipend of \$12,000. (An additional two years of support at this same level is provided by the participating institution.) The award also includes a comprehensive system of academic support.

Each annual renewal is contingent upon satisfactory performance and normal progress toward the Ph.D. degree.

ELIGIBLE FIELDS OF STUDY:

Eligible fields of study include any field in the Arts and Sciences, Business, Engineering, Health Sciences, Nursing, or the Visual and Performing Arts. Fellowships are especially encouraged in, but not limited to, the following disciplines:

Agriculture Business Administration Computer Science Marine Biology Physics
Biology Chemistry Engineering Mathematics Psychology

Academic programs that lead to professional degrees such as the M.D., D.B.A., D.D.S., J.D. and D.V.M., are not covered by the McKnight Doctoral Fellowship. With the exception of Ph.D. programs in Math Education, Science Education, and Educational Measurement and Testing, graduate programs which are housed in a university's School or College of Education (whether leading to Ed.D. or Ph.D.) are not covered by the McKnight Doctoral Fellowship.

WHO MAY APPLY:

An applicant must be African American or Hispanic, a U.S. citizen, and hold a minimum of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.

Since this program is intended to increase enrollment in Ph.D. programs, currently enrolled doctoral students are not eligible to apply.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY:

The Fellowship will be awarded only to persons who intend to seek Ph.D. degrees in one of the disciplines in the Arts and Sciences, Mathematics, Business or Engineering. In those doctoral programs which require entry at the master's level prior to acceptance at the doctoral level, institutional verification will be required.

The Fellowships must be used at one of the participating Florida universities previously indicated and will be awarded only to those eligible individuals who have been accepted for graduate study at one of the participating universities.

APPLICATION DEADLINE:

All application materials must be submitted on line and/or postmarked no later than January 15th of each year.
